

Issue Introduction

This issue of Arkansas Libraries is an exploration of the role of the modern school library media center in the curriculum of the schools for the 1980's. The curricular focus has been selected rather than a recreational or individual student approach to library media center programming because of the editor's firm conviction that the library media center concept is at a juncture in American education. While we have made great strides in bringing library media centers into existence in the last thirty years, we are still on the frontier of knowing how to make an impact on the learning activities in the school. The articles here set forth a framework for a curricular view of the library media center program in the hopes that library media specialists can plan and build a new program orientation.

The lead article written by the editor sets forth the components of a taxonomy of instructional involvement; all the other articles explore various levels of that taxon-

omy in depth.

Dr. Podemski, a professor in Educational Administration at the University of Arkansas, explores the role of the principal in implementing the taxonomy.

The article and accompanying bibliography on reference service was done by a reference class at the University of Arkansas in

the summer of 1980.

Dr. Brenda White, a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, is an enthusiastic and creative school library media specialist near Pittsburgh and is very active in American Association of School Librarians. Her article explores the concept that the library media center should be able to respond creatively to spontaneous requests made by students and teachers.

Dr. Blanche Woolls explores our responsibility to sell our programs. She is a professor at the University of Pittsburgh, has been a school library media specialist and a district library media supervisor, and is a tremendous and practical speaker about library media center programming.

Judy Pitts, a former English teacher and

now a library media specialist at Springdale High School writes an interesting fictional account of how she plans to include instructional design in her program. Her approach is very instructive.

Dr. Janet Stroud is a professor at Purdue University and has been a school library media specialist. Her writing on evaluation of library media center programs and on the handicapped has been well-received nationally. Here, she presents a very practical and realistic approach to instructional design.

Finally, Margaret H. Garrett, Library Media Specialist at Little Rock Air Force Base #2 sums up the challenge of the issue

from the view of the practitioner.

The editor wishes to extend appreciation to his advanced administration class members in the Little Rock area who helped develop the taxonomy. These persons included: Roy Sullivan, Frankie Holt, Margaret Garrett, Margaret Crank, Betty Schrader, and Ann Presley. Taxonomy Level 3 Maximum Use of the Reference Collection

One of the largest investments in materials for the school library media center is for the reference collection. If the collection is to be worth the price, it would seem logical that its use should be maximized. Yet, traditionally, the entire collection is non-circulating on the theory that the library media center staff can maximize reference responses only if the collection is available at all times.

A newer trend and one that makes much more sense is to allow all reference books to circulate for home use overnight and to circulate to classrooms if needed during the day. Those library media specialists who are afraid to circulate an expensive reference book should think twice before buying it in the first place.

So often, older editions of the encyclopedia are allowed to circulate but the newer editions are guarded. This policy guarantees that all papers written from these books have a high chance of containing outdated information! My recommendation to library media specialists who love to guard encyclopedias has always been: circulate the new set and guard the old set. At least, the currency of research papers will increase and if a volume is lost, you can limp along with an old edition volume until the new one can be replaced. One would wish that encyclopedia

publishers would come out with a paperback edition of their product. It would be cheaper and by the time the information was outdated we could throw away the set without a guilty conscience. Too many things are bought in library bindings which turn out to be shelf-sitters which will still be in pristine condition when your great grandchildren send their children to the LMC.

One way to maximize the potential of level three of the taxonomy is to have a very large reference collection. With shrinking budgets, however, this is becoming much more difficult. One solution is to coordinate your buying of reference tools with neighboring schools and the public library and then use telephone reference networking more often. Another solution is to buy every reference tool you possibly can in paperback editions.

Recently, the author taught a reference course and we decided to see just how many reference tools were available in paperback that would be appropriate for the school library media center. We took a trip to our local paperback book shop and made some lists. We found that tools for the elementary school were very few in number, but books for the junior high and high school were very plentiful. The following bibliography is our sifting of the best we found.
