Introduction

Perpetual Calendars is designed to work in conjunction with the popular program Print Shop Companion. Calendars will not work by itself without the Companion. Perpetual Calendars will not work with the Print Shop program. The Companion is available at most local computer software dealers or from Broderbund Software and generally costs less than \$50.00. Print Shop and Print Shop Companion are two programs designed by Broderbund to work together. Older versions of Print Shop have to be modified by the Print Shop Companion disk to be able to utilize fonts and borders from other disks.

Perpetual Calendars provides 48 complete months of calendars which can easily be modified to suit any year or month. It may also contain any information desired by the user. The authors have already entered information into the calendars, but the user has the option of changing any or all of this information to suit local needs.

The 48 calendars are divided into four subject areas:

Children's Literature
Young Adult Literature
Adult Literature
Library History

The calendars for children's and young adult literature include the birth dates of notable authors, their names, and references to works they have written. The calendars for adult literature include birth or death dates, names, place of birth, and/or significant works or events. The calendars for library history include significant events and the birth dates of important individuals. Chronological indexes to the calendars are included in this guide and on the reverse side of the Perpetual Calendars disk. The indexes can be accessed using the AppleWorks database. Users who modify the disk permanently should add their changes to the indexes for easy reference.

A quick example might illustrate the usefulness of the disk. Suppose a user wants to create a calendar for January 1988 containing children's literature items. The month and year are selected first from the Print Shop Companion program. Then the top of the calendar is created using any graphic available on the Companion, the Print Shop Graphics volume 1, Library Graphics disk or any other disk of Print Shop compatible graphics. Next, the children's literature calendar is pulled into the program. The user alters any of the children's authors or their works on the calendar. Finally, the calendar is printed out.

If the user doesn't like what is entered into the calendar, that information may be changed temporarily or permanently. Local events and local authors or people's birthdays can be included easily in any

calendar and stored permanently on the disk. A great deal of local interest can be created by including local children's authors on the same calendar with famous children's authors. Local library history events can be intertwined with general library history. Local or state authors can be added to the adult authors calendars. New winners of young adult literature prizes can be added to the young adult literature calendar. The possibilities are left to the creative imagination of the user.

Information for the calendars has been obtained from a wide variety of reference works. A number of famous authors' birth dates could not be found and could not be included, and some dates of birth are in dispute. For example, a birth date for S.E. Hinton, the popular young adult novelist, could not be located. Users of the disk are encouraged to send corrections or additions to the authors in care of the publisher.

Library history events posed the biggest problem. Often, no actual date of an event was available - only a year. Library events were included in a semi-chronological fashion from January through December. Thus, the entire spectrum of library history appears if all the calendars for January through December are printed out.

Users who want to mix authors of children's literature, young adult authors, adult authors, or library history events together on the same calendar will be disappointed. The calendars cannot be mixed automatically. The Companion also does not allow for weekly calendars to be printed out using the information from the monthly calendars. By printing out a monthly calendar, however, the user could easily create a calendar for the week, leaving plenty of space for local events.

The limitations on each of the calendar sets are discussed below.

Children's Literature

The problem in creating the children's literature calendar was that the number of children's authors exceeded the room on the calendar. Another problem was that six authors might have been born on the same date and no authors on another date. Since the calendar space on the Companion was so limited, the choice of which authors to be included had to be made rather arbitrarily.

To make the calendars more useful, a chronological index to all the authors of children's literature that we found is included in this guide and on the disk. The database on the disk can be arranged in alphabetical order. Thus, the user can look over the index by date or alphabetically by author and cross check the calendar. This can be done with the indexes for children, adult, and young adult literature and library history as well. Favorite authors can be included in the calendars and updates made very easily.

Almost all Newbery and Caldecott winning children's authors have been included when dates were available. Classic children's literature as well as current notable works are included. In addition, selected illustrators have been included.

Young Adult Literature

It was difficult to decide what authors to include on the calendars since the reading of young adults spans both children's literature and adult fare. A mix of current junior novel authors, popular adult authors read by teens, and a few classic authors generally read by young adults has been included.

Adult Literature

There were simply too many adult authors to include in a single set of calendars, so some notable examples from a number of genres were included.

Library History

The library history calendars combine the birth dates of famous librarians; important events in library development; the development of books, printing, and publishing; and the development of technology which has affected libraries. For example, one of the interesting events recorded is the debate over the acceptance of the typewriter as a means of producing catalog cards.

In most cases, the famous librarians included are deceased. The user may want to add a set of famous librarians, including your staff birthdays and those administration, governing board, etc.

It was almost impossible to try to locate an actual date for many library history events. It was decided to place the events chronologically on the calendars from January through December. Thus, the library event probably did not happen on the date it appears, but did occur in the year indicated. If all twelve calendars are printed out, a chronological history of libraries is presented with a few famous librarians' birth dates.

Instructions for Use

Requirements for the Program

1. An Apple II +, IIe, or IIGS computer (as required by the Print Shop Companion).
2. The Print Shop Companion program (Print Shop may be required to change printer settings).
3. A printer which can be configured to print out the Print Shop Companion calendars.

Directions

If you are unfamiliar with the Print Shop Companion program, work with that program until you can both create and print out monthly calendars. The following directions assume some familiarity with the Print Shop Companion program.

To print out one of the calendars already on the disk:

1. Boot the Print Shop Companion disk.
2. CALENDAR (Return).
3. FROM OTHER DISK (Return).
4. Type in the name of the calendar [see the table of Contents below] (Return).
5. Choose a graphic or no graphic (Return).
6. Choose a year (Return).
7. The month lit up should match the one you loaded from the data disk (Return).
8. Choose a font (Return).
9. Change line 1 if you wish (Return).
10. Change line 2 if you wish (Return).
11. Return.
12. Add a one-liner to bottom of calendar or press return.
13. PRINT (Return).

To change the information in the calendars, follow the directions above to step 11. The Companion lets you move the cursor to any day and view it. Modify or change any information you wish using the editing commands on the help screen. Continue with steps 12 and 13. It is possible to save the new calendar on your disk if you would like to save it permanently. You may also start your own disk of calendars and leave the original intact.
