
INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

Vol. 1 is published by Hi Willow but distributed by Libraries Unlimited. The rest of the volumes are published by Libraries Unlimited.

Checking Whether You Have a Bad Disk

Occasionally, the master disk which you have received will have a problem. Here is the way to check for sure:

Apple Version: Boot a DOS 3.3 System Master (not ProDOS). When the cursor appears, take out the System Master disk and insert our disk in the drive. Type CATALOG. If the contents of the disk are displayed, you have a good disk. If you have "Print Shop IIGS" request a ProDos disk.

IBM Version: Boot DOS. When the A prompt appears, take out the DOS disk and insert our disk into drive A. Type DIR. If a listing of files is displayed, you have a good disk.

Instructions for Use

You need the following software and hardware:

 A copy of the original PRINT SHOP program which is sold at most software shops and dealers. This program costs from \$35-\$50. As an alternative, you may use any program which will utilize a PRINT SHOP type graphic. We have tested the following programs which work on the Apple: PRINT MAGIC and PRINTMASTER PLUS.

 If you wish to use the borders on the reverse side of the disk, you will need to purchase PRINT SHOP COMPANION, a program which works with PRINT SHOP and is an invaluable addition to the original disk. This program is also available from most software shops and dealers and costs between \$35-\$50.

Directions:

 Make a copy of the Library Graphics disk using any copy program. You can use the copy program which comes on the "System's Master" included with the Apple computer, or use the copy command in MSDOS. Programs such as "Copy II+" or "Locksmith" can also be used. The files on the disk are not protected, so they should copy easily. Retain the original Library Graphics disk as your archival copy.

Become familiar with using the PRINT SHOP and/or the PRINT SHOP COMPANION or other graphics program by following the directions provided with these programs.

3. Start the program and follow directions until you reach the step in "design your own" section that requires a graphic. Select FROM ANOTHER DISK. Be sure that the Library Graphics disk is in the drive and type the name of the graphic you want to use.







Welcome to the world of graphics created specifically for use in libraries and classrooms. This disk is one of a number of packages created for the IBM/MSDOS computer. For a complete catalog of all the Print Shop Graphics for Libraries disks, write Libraries Unlimited (the distributor of this program) at the above address.

Checking Whether You Have a Bad Disk

Occasionally, the master disk which you have received will have a problem. Here is the way to check for sure. Boot DOS. Be sure an A prompt is on the screen. Put our disk in the drive and type DIR and then press the enter key. If a listing of files is displayed, you have a good disk.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

Our disks do not work alone. They must be used with the program PRINT SHOP or other program which can utilize PRINT SHOP images such as PRINTMASTER PLUS.

There are now two versions of PRINT SHOP - the original version know as PRINT SHOP IBM version (no longer available in stores), and THE NEW PRINT SHOP IBM version. The graphics on this disk work with the original version but will work with THE NEW PRINT SHOP if you convert them (see the New Print Shop manual for instructions). The borders on disk two work with the original PRINT SHOP COMPANION IBM version.

Directions:

1. Make a copy of the Library Graphics disks using any copy program or DISKCOPY on your computer. The files on the disks are not copy protected. Retain the original Library Graphics disk as your archival copy. If you need to convert the disk to THE NEW PRINT SHOP version, convert the graphics on your copy rather than on the archival disk. You can always go back to the original if you need to do so. After converting, you should end up with four disks - the original and a copy, a conversion disk and a copy of that. Archive an original disk and a conversion disk. The same will be true of disk 2 - borders.

2. Become familiar with using the PRINT SHOP and;/or PRINT SHOP COMPANION or other graphics program by following the directions provided with these programs.

3. To use the small graphics: Start the program. When the MAIN MENU screen appears, decide whether you wish to design a greeting card, sign, letterhead, or banner. If you select the greeting card mode, you are asked to make a choice between DESIGN YOUR OWN and READY-MADE. Select DESIGN YOUR OWN. The next screen will ask you to select a border. Use the up/down arrow to highlight your choice, then press RETURN. At this time, place the Library Graphics disk in drive 2 (or drive 1 if only one drive is available). The the graphics name and press RETURN. You will not see the graphic until it is printed out. Continue to follow the instructions until the greeting card is complete.

4. If the above does not work, we suggest that you check with a friend who uses graphics from other disks in the PRINT SHOP program. They can often get you up and running in a matter of minutes.

5. If you are printing out on a 24-pin dot matrix printer, you may find that the graphics are skewed. Some versions of the original PRINT SHOP support only 9-pin printers.
