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#### Introduction

The purpose of the AASL Electronic Library is to provide a convenient repository of documents of interest to school library media specialists and students of the field. These documents range from AASL position statements, ERIC Digests, articles reprinted

from professional publications, research reports, statistical sources, directories, bibliographies, and articles written specifically for this collection.

A second purpose of the disk is to provide a fund-raising project for AASL to generate funds for worthy projects of the Association such as production of national guidelines. All monies over and above production and distribution costs will be used for worthy projects designated by the AASL Board of Directors.

As an annual publication, The AASL Electronic Library will become a repository not only of documents such as the ones already present, but of articles from *School Library Media Quarterly* and research pieces that will contribute to the decision making process for the school library media specialist.

Articles may be submitted to: Editors, AASL Electronic Library, 50 E. Huron Street, Chicago, IL 60611. This publication is scrutinized by the editors and their board, and in the professional sense can be considered to be a refereed publication.

Instructions for using the CD-ROM are printed on the slipcase of the CD-ROM cover. The files on the disk printed in Envoy which can be used on any computer in the view mode cannot be edited, but can be printed out, sections highlighted, searched, and notes made. User-made notes can be saved and printed out as needed. The name of each file is printed in brackets at the end of the index entry. Pull these named files into your computer as you would any file on the Mac or IBM. Each article is a separate file on the disk. A few files have hypertext buttons to assist in document searching. This feature will be improved in the next edition. As a courtesy, all the files either in WordPerfect format for the Mac or WordPerfect for the IBM have been included. Merely pull up these files while in the WordPerfect program as you would any file.

\*\*Ed. Note\*\* Two files defied all attempts to convert to an Envoy File and so is available only as a word processed files. The first is the [slmc9091] file which is available on the disk as a WordPerfect IBM file. Since it was a major government statistical report on school libraries in 1990-91, it is included. The second is [stats], a statistical report by Daniel Callison which is also presented only as a WordPerfect IBM file.

The production of this first edition was a labor-intensive project since the entire idea and its format was so new to the editors. There most certainly are errors on this edition. The editors beg for forgiveness and request that notification of errors be sent to the address above and corrections will be made in the next edition.

Many people have assisted in the production of this project. Originally conceived by David V. Loertscher as a project of his presidential year of AASL, the editors have spent many hours finding documents, editing, gaining permission, and discovering the method for putting the product on CD-ROM. Jackie Mancall, President of AASL, 1994-95 supported the project in critical stages, and the Publications Committee and the Board of Directors assisted as the project developed.
