Intellectual Freedom Round Table (IFRT) Awards

(John Phillip) Immroth Memorial Award for Intellectual Freedom

An annual award consisting of \$500 and a citation presented to an intellectual freedom fighter who has made a notable contribution to intellectual freedom and demonstrated remarkable personal courage. Donated and administered by the Intellectual Freedom Round Table.

(Eli M.) Oboler Memorial Award

A biennial award of \$1,500 presented to the author or authors of an article (including a review article), a series of thematically connected articles, a book, or a manual, published on the local, state, or national level, in English or in English translation.

The works to be considered must have as their central concern one or more issues, events, questions, or controversies in the area of intellectual freedom, including matters of ethical, political, or social concerns related to intellectual freedom. The work or works need not have appeared in the "library press," nor have been written by a librarian. The work must have been published within the two-year period ending the December prior to the ALA Annual Conference at which the award is given. Donated by Providence Associates, Inc. Administered by the Intellectual Freedom Round Table.

State Program Award

An annual award consisting of \$1,000 and a citation presented to the state library association intellectual freedom committee, state library media association intellectual freedom committee, or state intellectual freedom coalition that has implemented the

most successful and creative state IFC project during the calendar year. Donated by Social Issues Resources Series, Inc. (SIRS). Administered by the Intellectual Freedom Round Table.
