INTRODUCTION

Background.

In 1965, the author inherited the genealogical materials of Unity Chappell Knowles. Unity was the first of the family to undertake the searching out of her ancestors. She corresponded at length with the Salt Lake Genealogical Library and sent a considerable amount of money to England for original research on the Knowles and other lines. Unity was never able to extend the pedigree beyond her grandfather Richard Knowles and Sarah Rostirn (Rostron), but she did submit hundreds of names to the temple for LDS ordinance work. Since the research done by Unity, others have sought to extend the pedigree, among them, Alvera and Leslie Jones, and Lucile A. Jennings. The author has also spent a good deal of time and money researching the Knowles line with some success. One of the biggest barriers to doing the research is that the church records of the Manchester and Bristol areas of England have not been filmed by the Salt Lake Genealogical Society. The lack of record films has necessitated expensive original searches in England through hired professional searchers. When the author had spent considerable time, it seemed advisable to stop research for a time in hopes that the Society would gain permission for filming and then the task would be much simpler. The expense was getting prohibitive, so the author decided to try to contact other interested relatives in order to solicit funds for the research. The name collecting expanded and mushroomed until the present volume was conceived. Doing a volume such as this has required a tremendous amount of effort and thousands of dollars to collect. Had the author known that there were some 400+ families that were descendants of Richard and Sarah in America alone, he would probably not have begun. The effort has had its rewarding moments but also many discouraging ones. The waiting for replys that were never forthcoming, the broken commitments - all have been conterbalanced by meeting relatives that have enriched my life.

Purpose.

The purpose of the volume is to let the family of some great pioneers get acquainted with one another. It has been 133 years since the family decided to emmigrate to the United States. To do so required a substantial sum of money so each person had to earn his own passage. Richard and Sarah were the first to emmigrate and most of their children tried to follow, but the family was never together again — a price they all knew must be made if necessary for the conviction of their newly accepted religion of Mormonism.

Composition.

The present volume represents the descendents of only two children — Thomas and Caroline. There are many cousins, descendents of Dennis Knowles (and perhaps Margaret) still in England. A copy of this book is being sent to Manchester, England to be deposited in a library there with the hopes that one of the English cousins will find it and get in touch with the author or any other relative in America.

The compilation of the volume has been an interesting sociological study of families. It has been interesting to note migration patterns, family size, allegance to the religion accepted by Richard and Sarah, personality characteristics, patterns of naming, etc. Many branches of the family have bits and pieces of the story of Richard and Sarah and the hardships faced by their own branch in conquering the wiles of the Western desert. These have been included wherever possible. The Thomas Knowles branch has written a fair amount about their experiences, the Caroline Knowles branch much less. The author challenges the Caroline Knowles branch to compile more interesting stories of themselves and their families and make them available to the author.

Accuracy.

The information in this book comes, for the most part, from the families themselves. There have been numerous conflicts. For example, a parent would send children's birth dates and the children would send different ones. In most cases, the information submitted by the person in question was accepted — not someone else. In such an undertaking, there will be errors. Much information came from a telephon call and even though proof sheets were sent for every page to the families — many never returned them. Therefore, the information here should be considered as a guide rather than gospel. The author has had to type the manuscript completely. Proofing has been done in available time but many error doubtlessly remain.

A Note for Those Insterested in LDS Temple Work.

You will note that ordinance dates are missing. The author considers this information to be an immediate family concern and individuals must find these dates as they care to. A copy of the book is not being deposited in the Salt Lake Genealogical Society by the author. Before submitting four generation sheets, an individual should research each sheet carefully rather than copy from this book. Ordinance data for pioneer families are, for the most part, still in the Temple Index Bureau files and not on the CFI files (1978). This may change as time passes.

Updating.

The author has tried to incorporate a type of page in the book that would lend itself to updating. Each family is encouraged to update its own pages and send these to the author who will continue to keep a master copy. Put the author on your Christmas Card List! and that will help with new addresses, births, deaths, and marriages. In addition, the author has included two blank sheets (one with lines, one without). Photocopy these as needed and add sheets to your book. The reverse side of each page can often be used to add information.

Various Editions.

The Album is being published in several editions. One is punched for a three-ring binder and another hard bound. For those ordering the punched sheets, you will want to get a large binder at a stationary store for the pages. You can then add pages or rearrange as desired. You may wish to pull out your immediate family line and put it into a separate binder. The descendants of Thomas Knowles and Caroline Knowles might also be separated — any way that makes sense and has utility for you.

Extra Copies.

Only those books paid for have been printed. However, the book is not copyrighted, so you may make photocopies as you wish. The author will also make photocopies of part or the entire manuscript. Write for prices.

Arrangement.

The book is arranged in family order rather than alphabetical, i.e., first comes the sheet for the father and mother. Next, the sheet for the oldest child followed by all descendents in order, then the second child and all descendents, etc. The index at the back will help locate specific individuals.

THE STORY OF RICHARD AND SARAH KNOWLES by David V. Loertscher

As of 1978, the births of both Richard Knowles and Sarah Rostirn (Rostron) are not known. Richard was probably born in Glouchestershire, England in the late 1780's and Sarah in Lancashir County in the early 1790's. England at this period of time was in the midst of the industrial revolution. The invention of machinery to accomplish mundane tasks revolutionized living in the country and changed the everyday lives of everyone in the world.

Manchester, England was the center of great clothing mills and people from all over England came to the city to be employed in the giant factories. Manchester had over one million inhabitants in 1840. Such a great crowd of people had not been known before and living conditions were not good. Crowding, smog, unsatisfactory housing - all contributed to a new style of urban existence, much of which remains to be solved today.

It was in this city that Richard and Sarah were married on 18 Nov. 1816. They were married in the Manchester Cathedral of the Church of England. This cathedral has one of the largest parish registers in all of England and thousands attended its services. Richard was employed as a cotton spinner in one of the factories and later became an overseer.

There seems to be some connection for Richard in Bristol, England^{4,10} - perhaps this is the city of Richard's family. Bristol was also a manufacturing center and Richard may have gotten started there and then transferred up to Manchester.

Richard and Sarah lived on Grey street in Manchester³ and seem to have stayed there for some years. Since they were living there and had children until the 1841 census. At this time, Richard and Sarah became disenchanted with the traditional Church and began seeking something different. Evidently, they joined the Methodist Church for it was here that their last daughter, Alice was christened. In 1840, the first Mormon Missionaries came to Great Britain, and just a year later, Richard and Sarah heard the message of the missionaries, accepted it, and became members of the then strange faith in Great Britain.^{4,10} After their baptism, in Nov. of 1841, the family moved to Bristol – the reason is not stated, but perhaps to interest other of Richard's family in the Church. Here they lived in the Lawrence Hill area and became active members of the Bristol LDS Branch. In Bristol, their son Thomas, met and married Eliza Osborn, Sarah jr. married James Berry, John married Hannah Webb, and Caroline met her husband-to-be David Webb who was already married to Esther Olpin.

At this point in the history of the LDS Church, all converts were instructed to try to emmigrate to Zion - then Nauvoo, IL to strengthen the Church there. Indeed, it was the English Saints who flocked to Zion that gave new strength to the Mormon movement in the United States and provided many great leaders in their Exodus to the West.

The prospect of emmigration of a large family, all of whom were married, presented almost insurmountable problems for an ordinary family in England. Where were they to get the money for ship passage? The determination and courage of Richard and Sarah to follow the dictates of the Prophet Joseph Smith are evident in their decision to follow his counsel and come to the United States. One must remember that the U.S. was a very young country at that time, but the prospect of religious freedom and opportunity must have held a great deal of promise and excitement for the Saint in Great Britain. The decision was that each member of the family must make his own way - that the parents would go first and would help the others if possible. Fond farewells were said and Richard and Sarah departed for New York 18 May 1845. 11

When Richard and Sarah arrived in New York, they found that they could obtain passage on the ship Brooklyn which would take them all the way around South America to San Francisco and from there they must travel overland to the Salt Lake Valley. The Brooklyn Saints were traveling by water, while the main body of Mormons were exerting themselves across the plains. Interesting accounts have been written of the passage of the Ship Brooklyn and are instructive for their description of the hardhips faced by these brave people. Their leader was the infamous Sammuel Brannan whose life as both Saint and Sinner kept the group in a constant uproar over some matter or other. The ship visited Robinson Caruso's Island and was also blown off course to Hawaii where they docked for several days. They finally docked in Yuerba Buena, or San Francisco, as it was known.

At this time, the U.S. was in the middle of the Mexican War. The Mormon Batallion was marching across Arizona to San Diego where they disbanded and traveled to San Francisco to join the Booklyn Mormons in the trek to the Salt Lake Valley. When the Mormons arrived in Yuerba Buena, they found only a few huts inhabited by Mexicans and Indians. They immediately organized and set up a city. The Mormons were poor and immediately set to work trying far from San Francisco and wagons to carry them over the mountains. During their stay, gold was discovered not means to get themselves to Salt Lake. Richard and Sarah decided not to go. They were in their 50's and the prospect of a long journey over the mountains no doubt influenced their decision to stay. Harmony among the Mormons, had not always been good due mostly to the influence of Sam Brannan and so faith in Mormonism may not have been

Richard and Sarah were joined a few years later by their daughter Sarah who was minus her English husband. Sarah married well in San Francisco to George Torrens who owned a coal yeard and was a "Supervisor" in San Francisco. The combination of Torrens' success and the property that Richard and Sarah were able to obtain, kept them in comfortable means for the rest of their lives. They did have a great desire to have the family reunited with them and had hopes that the children would all come to San Francisco. We do know that they sent money to Thomas to come to San Francisco and probably helped John and Caroline to come.

John made his way to Winter Quarters, Nebraska with his wife Hannah Webb. There he died along with hundreds of other Mormons in the bitter winter endured there. His name is incribed on a monument at the Mormon graveyard there and can be seen when traveling near Omaha. The fate of Hannah is not known.

Caroline also came, no doubt with David Webb, whom she married in a poligamous union soon after their arrival in Utah.

Dennis, the oldest son, stayed in Manchester, England, where he as employed as a baker, raised a large family, but died in poverty.

Thomas brought his wife to Massachuetts where he worked to get enough money to come West. Because his wife was ill most of the time, he made little headway. Richard, however, came to the rescue and sent money to come to San Francisco. Thomas decided, instead, to come to the Salt Lake Valley as directed by Brigham Young - a decision be that must have been hard indeed.

We have no record of what happened to the other children of Richard and Sarah and since they were not at home in 1841, one assumes that they died as children, although documentation to that effect has not been found.

Some have raised the question as to whether Caroline and Sarah were really the children of Richard and Sarah. Christening records have not been found in Manchester but some were found in Bristol which correspond to the ages of Sarah and Caroline. This has given speculation to the theory that Sarah and Caroline may have been children of a brother of Richard's and that Richard and Sarah adopted them for some reason. Research should been this up.

Some have wondered if Richard and Sarah rejected the religion that had led them to the U.S. when they refused to journey to Utah. Parley, P., Pratt, the famous Mormon Apostle, 16 traveled through San Francisco on his journey to the Hawaiian Islands on a mission in 1851. At this time there was no Mormon Church in San Francisco and there wasn't a congregation for many years to come. Elder Pratt did, however, gather together what Mormons he could find and did hold services. Richard and Sarah attended those services and renewed their committment to Mormonism by being rebaptized. Since there continued to be no Mormon organization in San Francisco, both Richard and Sarah were buried by the Unitarians. Both were respected members of their city. 17,18

We can be proud of this great family for seeing the vision of opportunity in the new United States - for it is by their efforts that we all enjoy this great land. Their sacrifice was great - their courage and determination models for all of us. They were true ploneers in the best sense of the word - forging a new existence for themselves and their posterity - can we do less for those to follow us?

DOCUMENTS PERTAINING TO RICHARD KNOWLES AND SARAH ROSTIRN (ROSTERN) FAMILY

. STORY OF RICHARD AND SARAH WRITTEN BY UNITY ANN KNOWLES CHAPPELL AT AGE 89 (1946)

In the year 1846, my Grandparents, Richard Knowles, his wife, Sarah Rossiter Knowles, and daughter Sarah arrived in New York, converts to the Latter-day Saints Church. At that time, Orson Hyde was in charge of the Latter-day Saints headquarters in New York, and he advised that the Saints who wished to go to Utah should go by boat from New York up the Pacific Coast to San Francisco. Samuel Brannan chartered the sailing ship, Brooklyn, to take the Saints on that voyage. Among the Saints who went were my Grandparents Richard Knowles and family. They sailed out of New York harbor 4 February 1846, with 330 Latter-day Saints, men women and children. They were six months on the journey. After suffering many hardships, they arrived at Yerba Buena (San Francisco) of 26 July 1846, just as the war with Mexico was over and saw the American flag being put up. The ship's log showed a journey of twenty four thousand miles. When they arrived, they were a poverty stricken lot, possesing little more than the clothes they wore. In some respects, they had less than the pioneers of Salt Lake, for they had their horses, wagons, cattle and other things, but the Saints from the Brooklyn had spent what they had in paying their passage on the ship and the general expenses of a sea voyage. There was nothing else for them to do but to commence all over again to make new homes in that new world. San Francisco at that time was mostly sand dunes, covered with scrub oakes and chaparal thickets. The town at that time consisted of a few hundred people of mixed races. The Mormons went there seeking refuge from their religious persecutors, and history tells us that the Brooklyn Saints were the first exiles and pioneers of the Mormon exodus to enter the Mexico Territory. It wasn't long until relief came to them, for gold was discovered at Sutter's Mill race on the South Fork of the American river. For some reason, the water had been turned out of the race and a man seeing something shinning in the race, picked it up and found it to be gold. The excitement of finding gold grewland housing being short, some of the Brooklyn Saints took their families and moved to the gold diggings. There the Saints started a school which was taught by a Brooklyn girl; and the Saints were the first to have an English school in San Francisco. Gold being discovered in San Francisco soon brought hundreds of other people there. It was not long until their little town had grown to be a large city. Brigham Young told the Saints the gathering place for them was in the Salt Lake Valley. The Saints who had panned enough gold to buy horses, wagons and other supplies, left early in 1848 for Salt Lake. Hy grandparents remained in San Francisco. Their daughter, Sarah married George Correns and also stayed there. Through indistry and frugality, they soon acquired considerable money. When my father, Thomas Knowles, and wife arrived in America, his father, Richard Knowles, weent him money to pay their passage to San Francisco; but father knowing Brigham had advised the Saints to leave California, took the money and bought an outfit and came to Utah. He never saw his father and mother: after other left England. During my grandparent's life, like many others, they became quite wealthy. They owned a court in the residential part of tow called Torrance Court. They had beautiful homes which were rented. They lived and died there and were buried in the Laurel Hill Cemetery. In the year 1915, I visited San Francisco, that was after the earthquake and fire and all their possessions had been destroyed. I went to the cemetery where they were buried. It was a beautiful place with lovely flowers and vines. I was told the city cared for the pioneer graves. My grandmother and aunt Sarah were of buried in the same grave, grandfather and Mr. Correns in the same grave. A large marble slab covered their graves, which gave the date of their death, and they are resting in the land where they pioneered in the early days of San Francisco. (errors: Rossitter= Rostirn; Sarah Jr. on the Brooklyn?; Correns = Torrens; Mormons did not see the American flag go up - it went up two days previous to their entry)

p. 561 - Richard and Camparawaltway of page 1 cost of the tribe of Ofttimes joining the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in pioneer days brought many heartaches and physical hardships well as satisfaction and joy in receiving the Gospel. Some of these fine people never saw their loved ones again. Two converts Richard and Sarah Rossiter Knowles were among those who made such sacrifices for the sake of their religious beliefs. They emigrated from England bringing their youngest daughter Sarah; but leaving the abther members of their family to be went for later. It is believed there were four children, however, only a record of two is known. The Knowles family upon their arrival in New York were directed by Apostle Pratt to embark with other Mormons on the Brooklyn, destination California. Like many other Mormon families, the Knowles possessed little of this world's goods, but collectively these people owned a sawmill, a blacksmith shop, harness shop, printing press as well as farm machinery as a means of making a livelihood. The discovery of gold brought many changes, and soon the majority of the people had panned a sufficient amount of the precious metal to purchase outfits to go over the mountains to Deseret as their leader, Brigham Young, directed. The Knowles family were among those who accumulated gold, but they chose to stay in San Francisco where opportunities were more abundant. Although Richard and Sarah became quite prosperous, they remained true to the Church of their choice. They bought lands and houses for rentals as well as a home of their own. Richard dispatched the first money he could spare to England to emigrate his family. Thomas Knowles availed himslef of the opportunity and brought his family to Utah where he waited in vain for his parents to join him. Sarah, in the meantime, had married a Mr. George Torrens. The parents Richard and Sarah, the daughter, Sarah, and her husband are all buried in the Laurel Hill cemetery in San Francisco. The Thomas Knowles family who came to Utah have a large posterity in the Church in Utah, Idaho and California. According to L.D.S. Church records, Richard Knowles was born in Gloustershire, England and died in San Francisco November 29, 1859. Sarah was born April 22, 1789 in Warrington, Lancashire England. Death date unknown. Sarah, the daughter, died in San Francisco July 5, 1884.

7. THE BIRTH OF RICHARD

Unity Chappell, his grandaughter, listed Richard's birth place as Mancherster, England on 8 Jul 1787. This was on the original family group sheet that was sent into the LDS temple. The 1841 census contradicts this by saying that he was not born in Lancaster County. In Unity Chappell's templeRecord book, she states that he was born in Malhamdalin in the York". On the theory that she meant Malhamdale (parish Kirby Malhamdale) in West Riding, Yorkshire, a letter was sent to the Vicar of Kirkby Malhamdale and he made two searches of his register witch showed

RICHARD KNOWELS, SON OF ANN bapt. 7 Jul 1787

RICHARD KNOWELS MARRIED JUDITH BARKER on 18.12.1815

JOSHUA KNOWLES baptized 4.7.1830 son of Richard and Judith Knowles.

The above Richard and family therefore rejected as our Richard - is this where Unity got her birth date? Mildred Pearce Morgan said Richard Wsas born in Glouchester. The obituary of Richard says he was 75 years old at death - this makes him born in 1784. Bristol Branch records list Richard as age 58 in 1845 - this makes him born in 1787. The 1841 census of Manchester lists Richard as age 50 (means age 50-55) - this make him born 1790-1795.

8. THE BIRTH OF SARAH ROSTIRN

Mildred Pearce Morgan listed her birth as April 22, 1789 in Warrington, Lancashire England - this date and place rejected after research. Unity Chappell wrote in a letter to the genealogical library - His wife Sarah Roster born at Bradford Yorkshire England. - This place also rejected from research. 1841 census of Manchester states that Sarah was born int he country of Lancashire. The San Francisco cemetery record lists Sarah as 65 years old in 1856 - born 1791. Bristol Branch records lists Sarah as age 53 in 1845 - born 1797. Obituary of Sarah lists her as age 65 in 1856 - born 1791 - also lists Manchester as the place of birth

8.BIRTH OF SARAH JR. AND CAROLINE KNOWLES

The births of Sarah and Caroline have never been found in and English Parish (1977) however, the 1841 census states that they were born in Lancashire County. There does seem, however, to be some connection to the Bristol area for this family, thus when wome research was being conducted there in the parish of St. Philip and Jacob, the following was found:

Bapt. 8 Oct 1826 Sarah Ann d. of John and Martha Knowles/ St. Mary Redcliff/ iron monger.

Bapt. 25 May 1828 Caroline Amelia d. John and Martha Knowles/ Redcliff, Ironmonger.

Thus has come the speculation that Sarah and Caroline are really not the children of Richard and Sarah - perhaps children of a brother. Further research will be needed to establish this fact.

From the membership records, it appears that the family joined the Church in Manchester and not long after moved to Bristol. It seems that the family emigrates from Bristol with the exception of Sarah jr. who returns with her husband to Manchester. Note that several members of the family are missing. Dennis did not join the Church but stays in Manchester. No mention is made of Alice or Margaret — they must have died young.

11. DATE OF EMMIGRATION. Unity Knowles Chappell gives the date of embarkation from Bristol to New York as 18 May 1845. No source is given. They were on board the Brooklyn when it sailed from New York to San Francisco 4 Feb 1846. Unity claims that Richard and Sarah's daughter Sarah was on the Brooklyn with them.

12. VARIOUS PASSENGER LISTS OF THE SHIP BROOKLYN

Bancroft, Hubert Howe. History of California. Vol. 5, San Francisco, The History Co., 1886. p. 546: I have three lists of the Mormon immigrants, the most complete of which is that published in the Honolulu Friend, July 1, 1846, as a passenger list on the arrival of the Brooklyn at that port. Another was made before the vessel left N.Y. and is found in the Nauvoo Times and Season, vi, 1113; but many changes were made apparently before departure. The third list is one made out by Wm. Glover, Mormons in California, M.S., in 1884, with notes as to what became of the different members. There were probably a few non-Mormon passengers not named in the following list. See a biographic notice of each member in my Pioneer Register and Index...

(Richard and Sarah Knowles are not listed in this passenger list of the Brookly. Undoubtably, they were able to secure passage after the first list was forwarded to Nauvoo.

The following are the names of the passengers that went out to California in the Ship Brooklin and that either came to the Salt Lake Valleys or died in the faith in California, also their places of residence as far as I know... "Richard Knowles" died in the faith and wife.

Deseret Evening News, Saturday April 6, 1918. Article by Edwin N. Austin: Historic Trip of Good Ship Brooklyn (ustin was on the ship Brooklyn and gives a passenger list) ...Richard Knowels and wife.

Did the daughter Sarah Jr. emmigrate with the parents? The family history says yes, the passenger lists of the Brooklyn say no. There is a marriage of Sarah Knowles to Richard Berry in Bristol 25 May 1846, so if the emmigration date of the parents is correct, then Sarah Jr. was not on the same ship. Furthermore, her marriage is witnessed by her brother Thomas rather than her father which would usually be the case had be been available. She does turn up, however, in San Francisco but not with a husband, for she married George Torrens 4 May 1862. Sarah Jr. is not listed in the 1852 census of San Francisco, neither in the 1860.

(The plan at the right is taken from the above history and an X has been placed over the original lot. This lot was sold after several years to the Church of England which built a small chapel

on the site. Later, a large catedral was built on the site but it was destroyed in the 1906 eqrthquake and fire. The Episcopal Grace Catedral was then built up the hill and across the street where it remains today. The Knowles property was sold to an insurance Co. that built a nice granit-covered building. In the 1960's, this building was sold to a vocational school which now uses it. From the original site, the Knowles moved to 245 Clay Street or Torrens Court as it is known today. There are still apartment houses on Torrens Court – not the original, but built after the 1906 earthquake and fire.



Sarah Knowles is listed as a daughter of Richard and Sarah on the orginal family group sheet compiled by Unity KnOwles Chappell: Sarah Knowles, born 1816 in Manchester, England. Indeed, Richard is listed on the record of marriage of SArah and Richard Berry:

Registration District: Bristol: 1845 Marriage solemnized at the Parish Church of St. Philip and Jacob in the County of Bristol. No. 318. Married May 25, 1845 - Richard Berry and Sarah Knowles - both of minor age - he a bachelor, she a spinster - he a baker - both resided at St. Philip at the time of the marriage. Fathers: John Berry a gardner and Richard Knowles a foreman at cotton factory. - Married in the Parish Church according to the rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by me S. E. Day, Vicar. This marriage was solemnized between us, Richard Berry and Sarah Knowels in the presence of us, Samuel Gentle and Henry Naish. Certificate MA999360 issued 14 Nov 1972. (This marriage takes place after Unity Chappell's emmigration date for Richard and Sarah, Unity says that Sarah jr. was on board ship with her parents but she is not listed on the passenger list of the ship Brooklyn, she is not in the 1852 cnensus of San Francisco, and not rebaptized with her parents in 1851. She must have come to S.F. after 1852.)

Sarah is listed as age 39 in the 1870 census of San Francisco (born 1831), is listed as age 44 in the 1880 census (born 1836) and listed as age 19 in Bristol LDS Branch Records in 1845 (born 1826). She is listed as age 15 in the 1841 census of Manchester and is listed as being born in Lancashire County. At this time, she is living with Richard and Sarah in Manchester, but the census does not contain relationships. There is a Sarah Ann, d. of John and Martha Knowles baptized at St. Philip and Jacob in Bristol 8 Oct 1826. John and Martha are listed as being from St. Mary Redcliff and John is an iron monger (no evidence that this is the right sarah).



STORY OF THOMAS KNOWLES AND ELIZA OSBORN

written by UNITY ANN KNOWLES CHAPPELL(edited by DVL)

Thomas Knowles was born May 1823 in Manchester, England. His wife Eliza Osborn was born 11 March 1820 in Abbiston (Alveston), England. They were married in England and lived there one year before joining the LDS Church and coming to America. While in England,

Thomas learned the trade of weaving.

The young couple emigrated to America July 1, 1845. They lived in Lowell, MA for some time. Their first two children, Henry Thomas and Emily were born there. The little girl died after a lingering illness and Eliza was sick and weak most of the time, so Thomas was obliged to stay at home and care for them. Because of sickness and death, he was unable to earn money enough to buy their outfit to bring them to Utah. However, by this time, his parents in California (Richard and Sarah Knowles) had accumulated considerable money and were very anxious for the family to join them as they knew they would soon be very comfortable. Therefore, Richard and Sarah sent them money enough to pay their fare to San Francisco. Brigham Young had advised the Saints to leave California and come to Utah. Thomas believed in taking the advise of those at the head of the Church, so he took the money his father had sent and bought an outfit to come to Utah. The outfit consisted of a wagon, one yoke of oxen, one cow and the other necessary things that they would need on their journey.

They left Council Bluffs when their third child, Emeline Louise, was only ten days old. They left at this time because a company of Saints was leaving for Utah. Thomas took an old lady along to help care for Eliza and the children. It was a long hard journey for Eliza in her weak condition, but they were never sorry for the course they took. They endured many hardships, and had they gone to California they could have lived in luxury (pure supposition on your part, Unity). To illustrate how much they appreciated their home in Utah, I will give a few lines taken from a letter Eliza wrote to her parents and didn't send. She said, "We are all happy and would not exchange our mountain home for all the world and its contents. We have a lot and house, 20 acres of land, a team of oxen and three cows. My husband and I know how to appreciate these blessings. We raise beautiful wheat and an abundance of other things for our comfort. We have all the enjoyments we wish. We live in a city 90 miles from Salt Lake City. The Mormons have fortified their cities. Our wall is 12 feet high, 4 feet at the bottom, and two feet at the top. Entrance is at the North and South by large gates which are locked every night so the Indians can't come in and steal. They are friendly. Some of them work for us."

Three more children, Alva Gowan, Unity Ann and Sarah Maria were born to this couple in Nephi, Utah. Unity Ann and probably the others were born in the City of Nephi, as it was then called Salt Creek. She was in a two roomed house about 196 feet

East on Center Street inside the old fort wall.

Eliza died Sept. 4, 1860 leaving Thomas with five small children - Henry Thomas, age 13, Emmeline, age 8, Alva Gowan, age 6, Unity Anm, age 3, and Sarah Maria, age 14 months. Eliza had always been very frail and probably died of pneumonia. She was a beautiful woman, tall, thin, and dark. Her hands were as soft as silk, regardless of the rough pioneer life she had led.

The responsibility of father and mother rested upon Thomas and the oldest girl Emmeline. The responsibility of caring for the children with the povery and hard labor of the times, was a great credit to Thomas. He cared for the home, got the meals, took all the children to the fields with him while he worked, and did all the other things necessary. The children were watched very carefully and kept

inside the fort wall because the Indians were very troublesome. At night, Thomas took his turn guarding the fort,

In those days, traveling by ox team was very slow. Work was laborious and they lacked for efficient tools. The grain was cut with a cradle, raked with a wooden hand rake, tied into bundles, and carried into shocks to be hauled home by ox teams where it was stacked to be threshed. Sometimes winter came before all could get their grain threshed as there was only one threshing machine in town. The threshers would come very early in the morning. We prepared breakfast for them and also dinner. When the wheat was all hauled out of the fields, the children had the privilege of going into the field to glean. They picked up every head of wheat they could find, and tied it into small handfuls to be put in a sack and carried home on their backs.

The women also worked under great difficulties. They did their cooking by an open fireplace. There was a piece of iron fastened to one side of the fireplace called a crane that could be moved back and forth. On that they hung their kettles to cook their food and boil their water. Potatoes were roasted in the ashes on one side of the fireplace. Bread was baked in an iron skillet on the hearth before the open fire. Hot coals were placed under the skilletand on the top which were replaced until the bread was done. To make light bread they stirred flour and water together, kept it in a warm place until it fomented, and then made a sponge. Later an

LETTER WRITTEN BY SARAH ELIZABETH STEWART KNOWLES TO SARAH MARIA BROWN FROM ST. JOHN AZ, Jan, 20, 1885

My Dear Sarah: How to tell you our sad Arizona news, I do not know. You, however, know the worst, but not all. When I was busy getting ready for Utah, and all in happy spirits, Gertie commenced feeling bad with a cold. I doctored her the best I know how, but she got worse all the time. It went on like this for two weeks, then Florence commenced the same way. I took the best of care and called a nurse in but no one knew what was the matter with them. Gertie would go to sleep and although burning up with feber, would rest quite comfortable for a short time. Then would wake and cry and rave like one insane. Florence was burning up with fever but altogether different. She was quiet and we thought it was canker, worms, and C & C. It was none of these. Finally at wits end, we called in a doctor, a gentile. He said they were very bad. Gertie's was water on the brain and spinal complaint. The powders that he gave her, we thought did her some good. Florence's was pneumonia. He also gave her powders and she seemed to be a great deal better. He also recommended poultices and warm baths. Some of our brethern thought we had done wrong getting the doctor, he being a bitter enemy of the Mormons and a gentile too. Henry said that if he gave up any one it would be the doctor, as one or two of the brethern did not like to come and administer under the circumstances, we gave up the doctor. The sisters came and done what they knew. They kept getting worse until we found out that we had to part with one treasure. She suffered - oh so much. Convultions set in and we gave her unto the Hands of the Lord, and how hard it was. Two or three days before she died, I took down sick, bing all worn out and had to lay and see her suffer, not being able to hold or soothe her. Sarah, if you can imagine my feelings, but you never can. No one knows how I suffered and how I still do. I regret many things and now am lonesome. My mind seems fixed on my little sweet child, so good, so pretty. All of her talk was about her grandpa ans seeing her little Mary (cousin Mary, she meant). I can't dwell on this. To return to Gertie who was so bad, one night, we sent for sister Bates and Blinkey. They came and said only one thing would restore her to us. That was to draw a blister on the back of her neck, which she accomplished after trying three times. How she suffered, none can tell. She was a living skeleton. Her back bones came thru her skin and no one thought she would recover. But thank God, she did and is fatter today than she ever was, but is loosing all of her hair, which does not make her look very good, but we do not mind. Frank had a slight touch of the same complaint, but was not very bad. I was very bad with Pneumonia and one night, Henry went for the same doctor and I know he cured me. I was bad for three weeks and had to wear my poor little boy. He was well and good all of the time. I was getting better with my lung complaint, then I got Rheumatism in my back and legs. Am better now and can do all of my work. Henry did not have his clothes off his back for about two months, not to go to bed. He had to tend baby and us too. How we all stood it, I'll never know. Three times now we have got ready to go to the Temple and every time we have been stopped by sickness. What is the cause? Oh if I could only see you and talk to you, it would ease my brain. It would relieve on of so much suffereing, but I give it up and suffer in silence. It will sooner or less kill me and you will see my health gets poorer all the time. I don't know any one to speak to (my own folks, I mean). You are all so far away. Write often to us. Do not wait for me to write. Willie has been sick two weeks but feels better now. He is teething. Tell all of the folks to write, we need a little news. Mary and Eliza are here. I seldom see them. Sister and Brother Udall were very kind to us in our sickness. They visited and cared for us all they could. I can not write any more, perhaps tomorrow, I can, it is late. We are going to build a new house on our quarter section. Have now, I believe, all the materials for it. We shall live there this summer. It will be a good home for us and that is what we want. St. Johns is a big place and a nice one too. We are perfectly satisfied. If only I could run in a see you all once in a while. I am going to write to Dan this evening. He will never forgive us for not answering. Henry is tending Crosby's furniture store. Al is hauling hay from the meadow up into St. Johns. Tell Father to write us, also Emily, and Una. Hope they are all well. Is Ida still there and do you ever get to speak to her? is anything the matter? Emma looks quite healthy, they say, but have not seen her for four or five months. Will close with love to you all. I remain your affectionate sister Lizzie. Gertie and Frank sends kisses to their cousins.

STORY OF HENRY FRANKLIN KNOWLES Written by himself

I was born in Brigham City, Arizona, Sept. 26, 1876. Brigham City was a Mormon Colony settled by Saints in 1870 and was named for Brigham Young. The location was on the Little Colorado River about one mile from Winslow, the present site. Some people were so discouraged when they saw the place that was to be their new home they turned around and went back home. My parents were authorized to set up the little camp and organize and all live the United Order. It was sometimes called theBallenger Camp because this Elder was put in charge and there was also another camp across the river by the name of Sunset Camp. Called camps because they were camped in their wagons until the fort was built. The whole camp was about 100 yards square. While the fort was being built the Saints had camped on the river a mile below and at this point a baby girl was born to one of the couples. She was the first white child born in the community and I was the first child born in the fort. Of the two camps, the Sunset Camp was by far the most religious. On the trip down, they had prayers twice a day while in our camp there wasn't a public prayer offered on the entire journey.

The fort had four entrances in the centers of all four sides. It was surrounded by a mud wall about two feet thick at the base and tapered to about twelve inches thick at the top. It was approximately eight feet high. The fort began with a room on the west side of the south gate. There there would be a vacant room next about ten feet square and only a porthole large enough to see through and to fire through at Indians in case we were attacked. The roof was flat and made of mud. No chance for anything to catch on fire in case Indians shot flaming arrows. In the vacant room we stored our wagons. Then another room the same size as the first room. The first rooms were finished and given to the expectant motiers. One other couple occipied the first room and the second room was given to my parents. This was the order of expectancy of these two mothers but I cam first so I was the first child born in the fort. In the center of the fort was a lage room and commissary and kitchen and dining room where everyone ate together. A lot of people didn't like this arrangement. My father used to say there were things about the set-up at the fort he didn't like. He said they would assemble in the dining room for morning prayers and to bless the food. One morning, the g'oup would do the praying for all. My father said this prohibited the children from being taught to pray or bless the food, as they would have done if each group had prayed individually. Uncle Dan Brown of Nephi jokingly said, "I refuse to ask the blessing on the food unless they let me hold the pie."

These people were all different nationalities. My mother landed in this little colony one year after emigrating from England and she could make a good meal out of a cup of tea and a little bread an butter. And many times there was no butter and sometimes no tea. My mother was a very wealthy girl in England and you can imagine the hardships s'e suffered in Arizona. I rem mber my father grinding enought wheat on an old coffee mill, a job that would take hours, to make enough flowur to make bread the next day and my mother would save the bran and when things got desperate and there was no flour, she would sift the bran to get just a little more flour. I remember my father giving us a piece of bread and he said he would put snakes on it. He would get the jar of molases and make snakes around our bread and sometimes the snakes were mighty thin. My father was a carpenter by trade. He set up an ran the first grist mill used at the fort. It was operated by power from the Colorado River. After moving to St. Johns, he made a trip back and secured the two stone burrs that were used to grind the grain and set them up in St. Johns and operated the first grist mill there also.

My parents told me repeatedly that the United Order was the most wonderful plan set up by men if it could have been lived. But jealousness arose among the people. They preferred to break away from it and use their own initiative. Some could do more work than others and felt they should get more money while others were happy and content with their lot. So the United Order was abolished from the fort. My father took one wagon, two yoke of oxen, and six young heifers. In the next spring, the heifers all caved. He was allowed the same wagon and the same oxen and the same cows but no increase. Some members pulled out and went back to Utah and took nothing. My parents went back to Nephi for a visit to my father's old home and my sister Gertie was born. They traveled all that way by wagon just a few weeks before she was born.

My father met my mother in Nephi, where she was visiting some missionary friends. She lived in Logan, Utah with an aunt after coming to America. She never joined the Church until after she came to this country. She wanted to stay in Nephi and not to go back to Arizona after my sister Gertie was born but my grandfather Knowles wouln't hear of it. He said, "This call to a mission is from the

Lord and they should go back and stay until they were honorably released. I want to call attention to the fact that my father bought my mother an organ for a wedding present. They hauled it to Arizona by ox team crossing the Colorado River at Lee's ferry. To get to the top of Lee's backbone, they had to make two trips and couple the ox teams. The organ was hauled with the first load then unloaded on the mountain while they returned for the balance of the load. That night with only a quilt for covering, it rained.

When they returned to Arizaona, they took my father's sister Unity Ann with them, and she returned home with other saints. My father's sister came down again with some of the later immigrants for a visit and stayed about a year. My parents came back to Utah on a visit and brought her home with them. On a later visit to her home in Nephi where she is now living and 97 years of age, she told me that I was born in the second room at the fort and not in the first as I had always thought.

When the fort brok up later - about two years, part of the Saints were advised to move up the river to the place called St. Johns. Some of the Saints went to Snowflake and others went to Springerville. St. Johns was called San Juan by the Mexicans. We didn't move into the old town out a mile or so North out in a field. This was what we called railroad lane. At one time, the railroad was put through from the east to west coast and people were anxious to have a railroad and the government was anxious for them to have it. So the government gave the railroad so many sections of land in every state they crossed so that whether the church bought this land from the railroad or whether we had to buy it, I don't remember, but the price was 50¢ a" acre. Anyhow, we bought the land. This caused trouble between the Mexicans and the Mormons almost from the start. They had run their sheep on this land for hundreds of years and din't like the plowing and fencing and taking part of ther range. Then there was the Gentile element or non-Mormon whites, mostly cattlemen who goaded the Mexicans into fighting us. For retaliation, some members of our colony would go to the sheds to hook up their team and find it missing. The other stock or animals in the same corral were not distrubed. After hunting for days, a Mexican would come and ask the man if he wanted to hire him to hunt for his horses. When asked if he knew where they were he would say, "No, me go hunt for \$5.00 payable in advance." He'd pay the Mexican, wait two or three days and then go to the corral and find the horses there. This was quite a racket and was carried on for several years. It was very harmful to the Saints because money was very scarce and really worked a hardship on the Saints. The Mexicans would come in our fields in the middle of the night, select a fine animal, kill it and haul it away.

While we lived here, my sister Florence was born - then my brother Thomas William and another brother, Oscar Dennis and my sister Ida. I want to tell here of an incident about my sister Florence as told to me by a neighbor, Mrs. Isaacson of St. Johns, when I visited there in 1947. Mrs. Isaacson was a girl of about 14 and I remember her coming to help mother with the work. She said she used to come to see my little sister Florence. She described her with lots of light hair inclined to be curly. I remember my mother curling it around her finger. Mrs. Isaacson sied this baby had the sweetest disposition of any child she ever knew. She also had a curl that hung down on her forehead. Mrs. Isaacson said, "I loved that baby girl with all my heart. Then she married and had her first girl she named her after my baby sister. She said her own baby had the same sweet disposition, the same light hair and blue eyes and even the curl on her forehead.

After leaving Brigham City, we homesteaded 160 acres at what we called "The Meadows", five miles below St. Johns on the little Colorado River. While living there, mother's organ was the only one in the community. The young people used to come in crowds and dance while mother played. Up would come the rag rug. Mother was a very talented musician. It worked a hardship on me, however. A little chap, long past my bedtime and the floor was my bed. While my mother played the organ, I used to lay my head on her foot. She told me that I awoke from my sleep and asked her if the crowd had gone and they were still there and they all laughed at me.

While on railroad lane, the General Authorities advised us to buy city lots. So we selected lots north of St. Johns and moved into town. In November of 1884, we lost my little siter Florence. She was about three and a half years old. Below is a copy of a letter my mother wrote to my father's sister, Aunt Sade Brown. I had the original but gave it my sister Gertie.

(the letter included here is the same as the one accompanying Sarah Elizabeth's page - 2)

The Little Colorado River provided plenty of water but would dry up in summer and my father said our crop would lack one irrigation to mature it. It would burn up and about a month later would come the rainy season and flood the very land that had been burned. There were two ferried at the Little Colorado River called upper and lower. In the early spring, the runoff on the water sheds above made the water considerably higher so the Saints used the upper ferry because the river was narrower here and this route took them up over Lee's backbone. The lover ferry is the one preferred to make the cattle swim the river. In driving the cows across when they reached the other side they would bawl for their calves and turn around and swim back. In this way, many cattle are lost. South of there was the Little Colorado River and in the spring with the runoff it was a raging torrent. One man by the mane of Rothlessberger was drowned and left a wife and two or three small children. We were living in St. Johns at the time.

During the rainy season, the cattle would go out to a puddle of water to drink and become mired and the Saints would hire cowboys to lasso and pull the cattle out. Horses seemed to be smarter than stock and would skip the boggy places. When we came back to Utah in 1889, I remember leading the horses to water and they were afraid to get near enough to the water to get their feet wet. They evidently remembered the quick sand in Arizona and if the water was too low in the ditch to drink, they would drop on their knees to drink rather than get their feet wet. Kids from blocks around would come just to watch how crazy our horses acted just to get a drink of water. While at the Meadows, I became interested in the various brands put on stock. I have always had a wonderful memory so I began studying brands, memorized them and then looked it up to see who owned that brand.

Cattle were fond of rubbing their necks on corner posts of fields. It was almost impossible to set the posts deep enough to hold because the cattle would rub them down. We used to set the posts baybe two or three by themselves for the cattle to rub on. We called these rubbing posts. I remember being to parties and if a woman's shoulder's itced, they would say, "If I were hom", I could use my husband's rubbing post."

While a young boy, I was attending the Deacon's quorum in our Ward which was the home of Apostle George Teasdale, in the North Nephi Ward and he told us, "Boys, I never had a greater amount of the spirit of the Lord even after I became an Apostle, than I did at the time I was a Deacon just as you are now." This impressed me, I wished I had never come to meeting. I was dissapointed. I couldn't imagine why he would make such a statement. I wondered why I should work so hard in the Ward, filling kerosene lamps, polishing the glass, making fires, sweeping the floors and dusting the benches, thinking perhaps for my efforts I'd get the higher priesthood. At thit time, I had no ambition, never thought of ever being ordained an Elder, Seventy or High Priest which I am now. Here I was sort of straddle of the fence not knowing which way to jump. In later yea's, my sister Gertie said to me, "Why did we obey father?" and I said, "I don't know, but probably because we thought he knew best." We never sought company of ill repute and we never went with anyone that drank or smoked. To tell the truth, I was being blessed right then and didn't realize it.

In the Fall of the year, it was the Elder's job to haul a load of wood to each widow in the Ward and to each woman whose husband was on a mission. It was the duty of us Deacon's to follow and chop that wood into stove lengths. This was one time my father would allow me to use his new ax. For cutting our own wood, I had to use our old axe. It was dull so I just bent the wood until it broke. How wonderful those women were and how greateful. In those days, we had a porch on the rear of the homes. In these porches, we stored our hog feed and stacked the wood neatly. One lady sai", "Don't carry it, I'm glad to just have it cut. What a wonderful feeling we had. My heart as well as my head swelled with pride and joy. This was another blessing but I didn't realize it either. I remember Pres. Teasdale saying, "It's service that counts - the greater the service, the greater the blessing."

I had been accustomed to women telling me that I would grow up to be a worthless man - of course, I may have tormented their children a little to aggravate them.

After an absence of 52 years, I returned to my birthplace on a business trip for my company, Porter-Walton Seed Co. I asked someone

in Winslow for directions to the old fort. I didn't know until then that there were four ga^tes. I remembered on gate facing the South wall. I asked the owner of the ground there to take my picture standing on the spot where I was born. And he scraped the soil with his foot and uncovered part of the hearth in the first room.

Many of the Saints became so discouraged they didn't wait to be released from their mission, they just packed up and went back home and the Church gave them their releases then, but my Father wouldn't leave until he had been released and he stayed on that mission for 12 years.

While I was in St. Johns, I was talking to a woman who had known my parents and as we were reminiscing over the past evernts, we began talking of the musical ability of my mother and how whenever they would have an event in the Church or a Conference, my father would haul mother's organ to the different places so she could play for them. This lady said come with me, Frank, and she took me into a back room of the house and there showed my my mother's organ. She had had it all these years

I have tried to write this story just as my Father told it to me. And it is every bit of it in his own words. Each time he would come to visit me, I have tried to get him to sit down and tell me these things but he always had so many things to do. I couldn't seem to get him to set down long enough to tell me very much at a time so I began writing a paragraph at a time as he would tell me and this is the finished story. One time when he was 78, I said, "Dad, do you realize when you die, this story dies with you, and if I don't write it, it may never be written?" and he said, "Well, then, when I'm too old to work, I'll write it myself."

Every bit of this story was told to me after my father was 75 years of age and it was all from memory except the dates which I obtained from the Knowles family bible. I hope sometime to be able to bring it up to the present.

Leo I'no les lived in Nechi until 2` years of age when we came to Idaho, locating at Rigby, and worked at farming and at herding sheep. He was a good worker and was loved by all who knew him. He had happy disposition, never criticized or judged anyone - virtues which most of us need to cultivate.

After 3 years of courtship, he was married to Edith Jane Pitman in 1917. This happy marriage was soon severed just one month and 3 days later. Edith's death was due to influenza which sw pt the world at that time. Edith was a pretty girl and a happy one. She was a beautiful singer and used her talent whenever asked. Around the home, she was a ray of sunshine. No one could ever be blue around her. Her death was a terrible blow to Leo and to all her family. In Nov. of that year, Leo enlisted in the Arm & sirving for 15 months as a cook in the 151st Aero Squadron. After Service, he returned to Rigby and again worked for farmers around Milo and Rigby, then herded sheep.

In 1923, Leo again married - this time to Edith's youngest sister, Isabelle. Though there was 15 Gears difference in Leo and Isabelles ages, it was a happy life. Isabelle was well matured for her 18 years, for she had been taught to keep house b Ca wonderful mother - one who was an emaculate house keeper and who taught her daughters organiz tion. Her advice was, "Never let Gour work push you - you push your work."

Leo and Isabelle lived in Salt Lake City from their marriage in April till Nov. Leo was out of work, so they moved to Emmett. Leo worked on the construction of the Black Canyon Dam. In Nov. 1924, he went to work for the Boise Payette Saw mill where he worked until 1935. In May, 1935, Leo and Isabelle moved to Dietrich ID. The depression was on. Leo was out of work at the mill and he had a chance to go to Dietrich and run a farm. In 1937, Leo bought a small farm. Times werehard and Leo worked for a neighbor for 30¢ per hour – yet in 10 years, we had paid for our 50 acres. In 1947, Leo's health was so poorly, we had to sell our farm and we moved into the village of Dietrich.

On the 12th of Dec. 1951, Leo passed away. On is never prepared for death. We had lost a loving Father and husband. At the time of his death, I was cooking at the Dietrich School. What a blessing it was. Oct., 1954 I was called to fill a mission for the LDS Churcha. This was a girlhood dream come true. I served in Anderson IN my full 18 months. My first position in the Church was at the age 14 years, when I taught in Religion class. I have taught most all my life in the various organizations. I have served as President of the Primary, Y.L.M.I.A. and Relief Society. I have also filled two Stake missions. At 73, I still teach Relief Society.

I love my little town. Everyone are friends. In sickness, death, marriages, and births, everyone is there regardless of their Faith. My interests in life have been my home, Church, reading, crocheting, embroidery and quilting. I am thankful for the wonderful husband I had for 29 years. He taught me patience, and charity. My three children are so very kind and thoughtful of me. I do love and appreciate them so much. I am greatful too, for my many many friends and relatives. My wish is that I can continue to serve the Church and my fellowmen.



FUNERAL SERVICES HELD SUNDAY


Funeral services for Henry T. Knowles. Indian War Veteran and pioneer of Utah and Arizona were held Sunday afternoon in the North Ward Church with Bishop Charles H. Grace in charge, Thomas Vickers, W. A. C. Bryan, A. J. Gowers, and Bishop Grace were the speakers and told of the sterling qualities of the deceased: Musical selections were rendered by Miss Merci Goldsbrough, Mrs. Diane G. Booth, L. P. Anderson Flossie Carter and T. W. Vickers. Alongo Ingram offered the invocation and Bishop A. H. Belliston gave the closing prayer.

Mr. Knowles was born at Lewell, Massachuetts, April 10, 1847 and came to Nephi with his parents in 1853, he went through all the hardships incident to pioneer life and took an active part in fighting the Indians. In 1875 he married Elisaboth Stewart and the next year was called by the church to go to Arisons. to help establish settlements and to commence the United Order. . The trip was made with an or team and took from February 21 to May 12 to complete the journey. The family located at Brigham City, Arizona, living there until 1881 when they moved to St. Johns, Apacha County, Here they encountered much trouble with the Indians and also with the Mexicans In 1889 they returned to Nephi.

In May, 1894 his first wife died leaving six children. He was married to Maud Crosby in November, 1396 and to that union two children have been born, Elece and Maude. The fol lowing children survive him: Mrs. Gertrude Williams, Salt Lake, Mrs Ida Koch, Compton, California, Leo Knowles, Rigby, Idaho, Frank Know les Salt Lake, Alva Knowles with the U. S. Navy, Elece and Maude Knowles Nephi. Also the following stepchildren, Leo Crosby Omaha, Nebraska, William Crosby, Bishop, California, Mrs. Scott Bringhurst, Bennion, Utah, Charles Crosby, Salt Lake Mrs. T. G. Struthers, Milford, and Mrs. Elam Mecham Nephi.

He has two sisters and one brother still living. Alva G. Knowles, Salt Lake City, Mrs. Unity Chappell, Stake Relief Society President of the Juab Stake, Mrs. Sarah Brown member of the South Ward Relief Soclety presidency.

MRS. SUTTON DIES SUDDENLY. The death of Mrs. Emeline L. Sutton last Monday was a shock to her many friends. She had been suffering for over a year from diabetes - in fact, ever since the death of her husband, she seems to have been suffering from this malady. She had only been confined to her bed about three days.

She was born in Council Bluffs Iowa, 59 years ago, while her parents were on their way from England to Utah. When she was 6 days old, the journey was resumed, and the first few weeks of her child-hood days were spent amid the hardships of the plains. Her parents first stopped off at Spanish Fork where they lived for a season, later moving to Nephi where she subsequently married Henry Sutton, and has resided here ever since.

The deceased was always a loyal church worker, having served as Sunday school teacher, president of the First Ward Primary, and teacher in the Relief society. She was a devoted wife and mother, self-sacrificing, ready at any time to help anyone in need, she was a good neighbor, and well like by everyone. She was the mother...

STORY OF EMMELINE KNOWLES SUTTON --by Ava Roberts

Emaline Louise Knowles was born 5 June 1852 the daughter of Thomas Knowles and Eliza Osborn. Her parents were baptised into the Mormon Church 10 or 11 years before and were in the process of emigrating to Utah when Emaline was born. Their wagon train had gone as far West as Council Bluffs, Iowa when Emaline was born. The entire company stopped until her mother was able to travel again.

Her parents were among those to go to Nephi, Utah to colonize. They took their two little girls and their little boy and went to Nephi to farm and make their home. Two more girls and one boy joined their family after they had made their home in the West.

When Emaline as only 8 years old, a great sorrow came into her life through the loss of her mother. Eliza had been very frail for some time and finally died with T.B. She left a family of five children. As Emaline was the oldest girl, it fell on her shoulders to help the smaller children. Her father, Thomas, never remarried but lived on for his family. He as a very clean man and expected his children to be the same. Emaline remembers his smelling the dish rag to make sure it was clean.

When Emaline was 20 years old, she married a boy from her home town, Henry John Sutton. They rode to Salt Lake to be married in the old Endowment House in a wagon.

Emaline was the mother of five children, two boys and three girls. When her family was small, her husband was called upon to help fight the Indians during the trouble with the Indians. One night, as he was taking his turn watching at the fort, Emaline was startled by having a big old Indian slip into her home. She was there alone with four small children and no means of protection. She quickly picked up the hot fire tongs and hit the Indian. He screamed as he was burned. This helped sound the alarm to the men at the fort who ran to her rescue and drove the Indian away.

Emaline was a very good cook and made exceptionally good pies. One Christmas Eve, she had invited friends over to celebrate and she served some mighty good pie. Grandpa just had to have another piece which gave him accute indigestion and before they could get help, he died. This was a terrible blow to Emaline since only two year before, her daughter Sarah had passed away from child birth.

After the death of her husband, Emaline visited often with her family and how we loved her. She developed sugar diabetes which finally took her life just after her 52nd birthday. She was buried in the Vine Bluff Cemeter in Nephi next to her beloved companion.

Emaline was a very religious woman and was president of the Primary for many years. Her love for children was so outstanding throughout her life and Primary was her love.

Grandma Sutton was very close to me, being the first grand daughter. I shall never forget her. She spent many hours with me and Pearl making doll clothes and cutting paper dolls out of the Sears catalog.

I can still reflect riding on Grandpa's knee and him singing to me "Oh I really can't keep still, Oh, I really can't keep still", and then I was bucked off. God bless them. They were truly great pioneers!



Janet moved around with the family in her early years but then finished high school in Salina. When I graduated that year, the family made plans to move to Kanab UT. I worked in Kanab until the winter semester and then attended S.U.S.C. at Cedar City UT. In June, I camp home and worked that summer so I could attend Henager's College in Salt Lake City in the Fall.

Janet did well at Henager's. She held the highest awards in shorthand and typing and did exceptionally well but she still wanted more schooling so she attended Dixie College at St. George. She loved Dixie immediately. She was put on the Associated Women's Council the first year, was active in music both in choral and solo work, singing with the Dixie dance band, and performing for assemblies and other campus activities. She had one of the lead roles in "How to Succeed in Business Without Trying" as Hedy LaPue. At this time. Janet's brother, Heber, introduced her to a former missionary companion. Ted DeMille and they began to date.

On May 3, 1968, however, our greatest tragedy struck our family when Janet was operated on for a cancerous tumor - fibro-sarcoma within her chest cavity. outside her lung. A four pound cancer was removed, along with part of four ribs in an effort to get all of the growth. Still she and Ted were married on May 31 as they had planned at the Manti Temple.

Ted joined the Navy that summer and had, after his boot training, and opportunity to attend more schooling at Memphis TN. They loved it there and were very happy but they were ecstatic when they found they were expecting their baby. In August, Ted's school was through and he was sent back to San Diego for more training. They returned from San Diego in October for Janet's Grandmother's funeral. While in Salt Lake City, Janet decided to have a check-up with her doctor. He found her cancer back and spreading down her right arm and shoulder and asked if he should try to remove it. Ted refused to let them. Janet was carrying her baby and the change in her hormones had increased the rate of growth. Cobalt treatments were tried - a lead shield protecting the unborn baby. By Dec. the doctor felt time was of the essence so they started the birth and Cory came into the world Dec. 18, 1969. The day after Christmas, the doctor put Janet on chemo-therapy. The chemicals caused her to lose her hair, weight, and finally she was so sick she was confined to bed most of the time. One day she came home from the experiments and said "the chemicals are killing me and I think I'd just as soon die of cancer." She put herself on a health diet, cleaned her system of the chemicals and started living on sheer faith!

Months went by and then Mona heard of somebody in Las Vegas who claimed they were cured. She went down for treatments. A French Canadian lad packed her in poultices that drew matter out through the pores. Bandages had to be changed daily. She was fed, bathed and cared for by this family. The lady could only speak French. Her sister was the translator and helped change the bandages. It was very painful - like boils which festered. Ted came down from Brigham Young University where he was attending school to visit. Janet's parents came and brought Cory each weekend for the six weeks it took. When the pain was the worst, Janet had to have a special blessing. Several hours went into preparing for that and when Ted gave it to her, he promised her she would live.

In Jan, 1972, she had her second child, a darling baby girl, Tiffany — born while they were living at Wymount Terrace at Provo UT. That next year, Ted transferred down to Cedar City UT to attend Southern Utah State College. He graduated with high honors, receiving the Pestalozzi Award for best teacher and the award for vocational education. For a year, he student taught at Parawan High School and taught one year in the Parawan L.D.S. Seminary. Sunny Ted was born that year. The seminary sent him the next year to teach at Miami AZ. They lived there two years and when he was asked to teach at Viewmont High at Bountiful, he was delighted. In the Fall of 1977, he decided to return to work on the Master's degree at Brigham Young University. Cory, now 8, Tiffany, now 6, and Sunny, 4, along with Janet and Ted moved back to Wymount Village. At Christmas break, however, they had need for a full time man at Orem High School Seminary where he is now. They hope to build a home there, sink some roots and raise their children. Both are active in school and Church activities. The Lord has blessed them abundantly. Because of faith and prayers, Janet is able to do her own work and care for her family and keep smiling!



The funeral will be held in the tabernacle Sunday afternoon at 3-20. The mother and family have the heartfelt sympathy of the entire community. A full account of the funeral and his career will be given in the next issue of the Times.

Obituary - JUDGE CHAPPELL DEAD PROMINENT NEPHI MAN'S SUDDEN TAKING OFF (Special to the Hearld. Nephi, Utah, Feb. 4. - Judge F. W. Chappell died at his home in this city shortly after 3 o'clock this afternoon, from neuaragia of the heart and Bronchitis, after a few days illness. Judge Chappell was 45 years old, and one of the best known men in this part of the state, having been in public life for the past fifteen years, both as a state and county officer and practicing attorney in the supreme and district courts. His sudden death has caused a feeling of profound sorrow in the community.

WHEN DIED

BRIEF BIOGRAPHY OF THE LIFE AND LABORS OF UNITY ANN KNOWLES CHAPPELL ----Compiled and w^litten by herself at the age of 37 years

I was born May 5th, 1857 in the City of Nephi, then called Salt Creek in a two roomed house, about 196 East on Center Street, and inside of the old Fort wall. I am the daughter of Thomas and Eliza Osborn Knowles. My mother died Sept. 4, 1860, leaving my father with five small children: Henry Thomas age 13, Emmeline Eliza Age 8, Alva Gowan age 6, Unity Ann age 3, Sarah Maria age 14 months.

The responsibility of father and mother rested upon my father, not only the responsibility of caring for the children, there was posvery and hard labor, but he performed the task with great credit to himself and beneficial to his family. He must care for the home, see to the meals, in the midday take us all to the field with him, labor hard all day and return at night, to perform the same tasks. I don't remember much of the days, except that we were watched very carefully and kept inside of the fort wall on account of the Indians who were very troublesome at that time. At night my father would take his turn guarding the fort.

In those days, traveling was very slow by ox teams. Work was slow and laborious and they worked to a great disadvantage for they hadn't the facilities to work with. The grain was cut with a chadle, racked with a wooden hand rake, tied into bundles, carried into shocks to be hauled home by ox team, stacked waiting to be thrashed. Sometimes winter would come before all could get their grain thrashed as there was only one thrashing machine in town. The thrashers would come very early in the morning. We prepared breakfast and dinner for them. The hay was cut with a scyth, all of it wild hay, that must be hauled home from the north meadows. All other work must be done by the same disadvantages. When the wheat was all hauled out of the field, we had the privilege of going in the field gleaning. We picked up every head of wheat we could find and tied in small handfulls, put it in a sack, carried it home on our back. When father thrashed we put it through alone. It was then our own to do as we liked with it.

The women and children also worked under great difficulties. They most do their cooking by an open fire place. There was a piece of iron fastened to one side of the fire place called a crane that could be moved back and forward. On that they hung their kettles to cook their food and boil the water. Potatoes were roasted in the ashes on one side of the fire place. Their bread was baked in an iron skillit on the hearth before the open fire. Hot coals wire placed under the skillet and on the top which were replaced till the bread was done. To make light bread, we stirred flour and water together, kept it in a warm place till it fomunted, then made a sponge. When that was light, we mixed our bread. We converted the coals up every night to keep live coals to start our fire the next morning. If our coals died out in the night we would go to our neighbors and get some. Later, an old lady made hopt yeast to sell. We would take flour and she would give us as much yeast as flour. When my father bought our first stove called a step stove that was sure a luxury. Then we had two nice clean kettles to cook our food in and an oven to bake our bread in.

To make soap, we had what we called a leach. We filled it with hard wood ashes, poured water over them. When it drained off, we boiled the water down and put in the greese. It made a soft soap. As it was difficult to make, we couldn't afford to use it to clean with. As our furniture was all home-make and without paint, we scrubbed our chairs, tables and floors with white sand. They were kept white and beautiful.

The winters were very cold. We had difficulty in getting sufficient water to use as the creek would freeze over. They must chop holes in the ice for the animals to drink and through those holes we would get water. Where we lived, we had to carry the water one block and a half. On wash day, we took a wooden sled with a tub. (the tub was also made of wood) that way we got water enough to do our washing. We melted snow for washing dishes and hands. In the summer, we used the water from the irrigation ditches. When it rained, we would hurry and fill buckets and tubs as the water in the irrigation ditches was very muddy. When we kiddles were thirsty, we would just lied down by the ditches and drink. (I guess there were no seconds.)

In the spring after the sheep were sheared, the women must wash the wool; pick it and get it ready to take to the carding mill to be made into roles. To have gray, black and white roles, the wool was mixed. Then came the task of spinning. As soon and I was old enough, I did a great deal of the spinning at our bome. I must spin three or four skeins a day. When that was done, I could have the rest of the day to play in my father's home. We had an empty room upstairs. There I had my wheel. To make the days

more pleasant an not so long, I invited two of my firends to bring their wheels and spin with me. Their names were Alic Evans and Stena Christensen McCarthy. We enjoyed the time together. After the yarn was spun, it must be colored. There was Indigo for blue, yellow was the bloom from the Rabbit brush, brown from the quaken Aspen, bark for black. The black wool must be made in roles by itself. My father, being a weaver in England, was not long in getting things together to do his own weaving. He made his own loom and all other things he needed to weave with. It was my job to help in any way I could. In the winter months he wove the cloth. There was flannel for blankets, linsey for girls, dresses, men's shirts, jeans and more men's coats, pants, etc.

While the men were so busy in the summer, the women and girls did many things out of the house. I have shocked wheat, husked corn, picked up potatoes, stripped sugar cane, milked cows, herded sheep, fed chickens and pigs, and many other things around the house and farm. I was taught to knit at a very early age. I knit all my own stockings and for most of the family. I kept that up until after I was married. I knit my husband's socks and the children stockings until my husband said it was enough and I must stop, which I did.

The chance of an education in those days was very meager, though the pioneers did the very best they could to give the children an education. Books were scarce and must be taken good care of. We had two books, the McGuffey Reader and the Old Blue Book Speller and a slate and a pencil. The first school I went to was in a three adobe house just north of where the Venice Theater now stands. The first teacher was Andrew Love. We had difficulty in preparing our lessons, as one book must do for all the family to prepare their lessons. Sometimes we prepared them at night by a greese light or a tallow candel or by the light of a pine log in front of the open fire place. The next place I went to school was in the Social Hall. We had the same teacher then. We had advanced some. We had reading, spelling, geography and arithmetic. To test our ability in spelling, every friday afternoon, we had what they called a spelling match. Two students would choose up sides till all were chosen. On one occasion, my sister Sarah and I spelled the whole school down until the last word was given me. I think the word was science. I put the e before the i. The next school was in a two roomed house where the Armery stands. We were taught by an oldman by the name of Farley and then by a man named Chapman, in a blue adobe building where the Central School now stands. I went one winter to Chapman in a two room house where George McCune now lives. My father taught me to write. He took lessons from a man by the name of Moneh Worick. He won the prize of being the best penman in the class.

In the pioneer days, the young people had very little amusements, only what they provided for themselves. We parched corn, played games, made molasses candy, sometimes a theater and a dance. At one time, the dances were held in the afternoon commencing at 6 P.M. and dance till 8:00 and have recess to take our partner to lunch. After lunch, dance till 10:00. They thought that was late enough for young people to be out at night. In those days, it would be a disgrace for any young lady to go to a dance without a male escort. If by chance I didn't get an invite, I would coax my brother to take me, sometimes father would take us.

Life went on about the same until I was about fifteen years old when my sister Emmeline got married, then came a change. The responsibility of the home was mine. I must see the meals were prepared, the house kept clean, washing and ironing done (no electric irons or washers), churn the butter, bake the bread and do many other things about the home. I did most of the sewing. I not only sewed for myself but made coats, pants for my father and brother. Father would get the tailor to cut them out and then I must finish them. In later years, my father bought a sewing machine. Of course that was a great luxury at that time. With all that responsibility, I never had the chance to go to school again, which was a great disappointment and disadvantage. I did the best I knew with no older person in the house to direct. But conditions soon changed. There were no more washing or picking wool, nor more spinning as there was a woolen mill in Provo. My father took his wool there and exchanged it for material to make our dresses, also material for men's clothes. He hired a tailor to make them. I think the tailor was Edward William. Also we bought our shalls. When the time came that we raised fruit, we picked the fruit and dried it and had cutting bees. The first coat I had, I sold f^Euit enough to buy it.

(here Unity tells about her grandparents and parents which is included at their story and not repeated here)

I well remember the first locomotive I saw. It was when the R. R. came South as far as York. My sister's husband took us to see the train. When I saw that big engine come puffing down the track, it was a thrill never to be forgotten. The first ride I had on train was when the R. R. was being built from Nephi to Juab. The young men working on the train invited several of the girls to ride with them on the engine as far as Juab. The trip was quite exciting. The first real trip I had out of town I went with my brother. Henry to Filmore to get the young lady he was going to marry, Elizabeth Stewart. She was living there with a family by the name of Hotbroke. It took three days to make the trip. I went as a chaperone. It wouldn't look well to travel that distance with a lady that wasn't his wife. We must remember in those days, traveling was slow. It took three days to go to Salt Lake City by team and three to return to Nephi. So I never went to Salt Lake until I went by train. I went to visit a friend Sarah A. Littley Harper. She met me at the Depot and took me to her home. In the evening we went to town. It was an inspiration to see the city hall lighted up. We had no large buildings in Nephi. In February 1876, my brother, Henry Knowles was called to Arizona with a number of others to build up that country. They settled on the Little Colorado. The place was named Brigham City. About two years later on, another company was called to go. My brother's wife was very anxious to have some of his people there, especially one of his sisters. A man by the name of Norton was going from Nephi. The metter was discussed and it was decided that I should make the trip. Norton would take me along if I would help his wife make the trip with her three children. We left Nerhi in September 1978. We left with two wagons, two yoke of oxen. We stopped the first night at Levan. When we came to the Sever River, we tried to cross it many times. Sometimes the oxen would start up the river and sometimes down. We would get up in the morning and make sour dough cakes. fry bacon. There was no change until we came near to Kanab, then we joined another company. They also were going to Arizona. They expected to settle on the Colorado River. Time passed more rapidly. It was not so dreary as there were three young ladies in the company and two young men. We would wlak far ahead of the wagons. Amuse ourselves gathering pretty rocks, picking wild flowers, sometimes the boys would climb high up the mountains and write our names on the rocks. Some of the names are still there. My nephew, Frank Knowles, traveled over the same road two years ago this spring. He told me he was my name on a rock. Every day was the same until one stormy night there was an addition to our party. A baby boy was born. We traveled on until we came to a place called Johnson's Springs. We stayed there for two days for the animals to rest. The women did their washing and got prepared to start their journey over the Buck Skin Mountains, now called the Kibad Forrest. That was a hard trip both for man and beast. Feed and water for the animals was scarce. Al the water that could be got for the oxen was obtained from holes in the rocks called pockets. When it rained, the water washed down the side of the mountains, which seemed to be almost solid rocks. The water settled in these holes. There they took the animals to drink. In some places there was small pieces of boards mailed on the trees with an arrow popinting to where water could be found.

There were many interesting things to be seen, different kinds of trees, many varieties of cactus. We passed through part of the petrified forrest where great trees had fallen and laid there until they became petrifed to solid rock. We traveled slowly on till we came to an old house called House Rock. We rested again. From there, the roads were very rough and rocky. Then we neared the big Colorado River. We couldn't see the river but we could hear it. Some of the boys took long ropes and let themselves. Jown to the water's edge. I don't think we rested again until we came to Lee's Ferry. There we stayed two days. While there, we met one of John D. Lee's wives. She told us many experiences she had had after Lee left her and went back to Utah. Then they rot ready to cross the river. Well, when I saw that large hody of water and the outfit they had to take us across, I felt we would all be drowned. There was a small raft just large enough to hold one yoke of oxen and one wagon. The women were taken over in a small row boat. It took all day long to get across. We camped by the river that night. Early the next morning, we started up the mountain. They called it Lee's Backbone. If there was a road, I failed to see it. I think that was the hardest part of the journey. It seemed each hill we climbed was a little higher, the other side more steep. When we got to and top of the mountain, it looked straight up and down. They chained all the wheels on the wagon so they would not turn around. We kept one yoke of oxen on to hold the wagon back. It looked like the wagon would surely go over the oxen, but all landed safe at the bottom' of the hill.

We camped there that night. All was not well with some of our party. There was another baby born, but died a few minutes after birth. They buried it by the hillside. That part of the company remained there to rest for a few days. We went on and traveled over rocks through gulleys and miles of sand and finally arrived at the fort called Brigham City. We were glad to be there as we had been five weeks on the journey.

The people lived inside the fort they built to protect them from Indians, though the Indians gave them no trouble. While there, I had the experience of living the United Order. Each family got their allotment, according to the size of the family and their ages. I also visited Lot Smith's fort about two miles on the other side of the river. They also lived the Order. All ate at the same table so everyone was served alike. Each woman took her turn in the kitchen. This didn't last long, the people were too selfish.

On one occasion, I went with some young people to another fort to get the mail. We had to cross the river. It took all day to get there. I think the fort was called Woodruf. We stayed there that night. It rained all night. When we got to the river coming home, the river had swollen so high the mules were obliged to swim across. We landed safe on the other side. I stayed there during the winter and spring of 1877. Left for home with my brother Henry. We passed over the same roads. The roads were much better and we had a good mule team. We were three weeks on the trip. I arrived in Nephi safe and glad to be back home among my folks and friends but no worse from my experiences.

On October the 3rd, 1880, I was married to Frederick William Chappell by Justice of the Peace John Borrowman. I was married in my father's home on 3rd South and 3rd East, in the presence of my father, my sister Emmeline and Daniel Brown. On April 13, 1882, we went through the endowment house in Salt Lake City. We were sealed by Daniel H. Wells. After my marriage, I still remained at my father's home and took care of the home. My husband was teaching school. On July 25, we had an addition to our family - a baby girl was born who we named Emily Louise. When the baby was four weeks old, my husband, anxious to complete his education. went back to Salt Lake City to the University. He stayed there until spring. He then taught school again. The next spring, we moved by ourselved into a house on Second South. On the 10th of November, 1883, a baby boy came to our home. We named him Fredrick Osborn. We lived there until the spring of 1886, then moved to a home located on 7th East Center Street. On the 24 of July 1886, another baby boy came to our home whom we named Robert Edward. We were still living in our home and my husband teaching school. On the 12th of November 1889 another baby boy came to bless our home. We named him Lawrence. My time was all taken up taking care of my family. In May 1890, my hueband left to go to England on a mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter day Saints. He remained in England until June, 1891 when he was released to come home on account of poor health. (a diary of this mission is in the possession of Dorrell C. Vickers and David V. Loertscher has a copy). After he returned home, he taught school at Mona for two seasons. The second year, I moved to Mona as it was hard for him to drive back and forth each day. We came back to Nephi when the school days were over. On the 9th of February 1893, we were blessed with another baby boy whom we named Conrad Thomas. All was well with us until the summer of 92. There was an epidemic of typhoid fever. My oldest son, Frederick contracted the fever and lay ill for four weeks. He passed away October 4, 1896. The next son Robert became ill, but recovered after three weeks. Then I was taken ill and remained in bed for three weeks. For two months we had a hospital in our home. Many kind friends helped us and we were thankful when all was well again. On May 25th 1896, another baby boy came to our home whom we namedAlva Gerald. He stayed with us till in January 30, 1913 when he was taken away by death. On the 20th of May 1936, I buried another son, Conrad T. Chappell, age 48 leaving a wife and seven children, one girl and six boys.

A few lines about my husband: Frederick William Chappell died February 4, 1899. His life was short, but he possessed indomitable will and accomplished much while he lived. He left England with his parents to come to America. When he arrived in America, they crossed the plains by team. As they journeyed on, he saw his father, mother and three sisters and on brother buried by the roadside. He arrived in Nephi at the age of ten years, without home, friends and no money. In a strange land where he must now make new friends and learn new customs. He obtained work wherever he could, but a boy of ten years could only earn just enough to live. Clothes he must do without only what he had. with all these disadvantages, he never went to school again, only night school in the winter. But with hard work and frugality, he obtained some property. His greatest desire was to get an education. He sold all his property and went to Salt Lake City to the University of Utah for one year. He came back to Nephi and taught school one year and then went back to school in Salt Lake City and then taught school. He went to England on a mission. Returning home, taught school and was elected County Superintendent of Schools. Later, elected County Commissioner. He studied law and passed the examinations and was admitted to the Bar. He was appointed District Judge by President Grover Cleveland. He lead the Tabernacle Choir and took an active part in the drama and many other activities of the community. After his death, all my plans must be readjusted. My greatest problem was to care for my family as heretofor my every want had been provided. With the assistance of the children and doing some sewing, we managed to live quite comfortable. When the children were able to care for themselves and were nearly all married, I commenced nursing. For fifteen years I was not at home only at short intervals. I have nursed my daughters and daughters-in-law in their confinements and many others in this community. I went to Mona, Springlake, Eureka and Goshen to nurse confinements. During the flu epidemic, I went where whole families were down. I was blessed with the strength to care for them and never contracted the fever.

CHURCH ACTIVITIES: I was born of L.D.S. parents, baptized and confirmed a mamber of the Church of Jesus Christ when eight years old. I was baptized in the old mill race of John Andres. I was taught to go to Sunday School, meetings, pay tithing, be truthful, honest, keep the word of wisdom. I was taught these not only by precept but by example. There were always prayers in our home. I never saw tea, coffee or liquor or tobacco in my father's home. I have tried in a weak way to obey his teachings.

I was a member of the first Improvement Association, then called the Retrenchment Society. I joined the Relief Society on April 18, 1872 and have retained that membership to the present time. I was called as a teacher in the R. S. in the year 1901 inc onnection with Alice Winn and Elizabeth Cowan. I labored in that capacity until October 1908. I was called, set apart as secretary of the Juab Stake R. S. by Apostle Geo. Teasdale. I was secretary until March 1905. I was then chosen as Counselor to President Adde Cazier. I workedwith Sister Cazier until April 29, 1906, when I was made President of the Juab Stake R. S. My counselors were Priscilla Lunt and Amy B. Grover. I was released as President August 7th, 1924, having labored in the Stake for 23 years. At that time, there were four organizations in the Tintic district that were visited yearly. We held monthly board meetings and were required to give a monthly report of our activities to the President of the Satke, Pres. Paxman. One Stake officer met with each ward at these monthly meetings. We carried on the lessons Pres. Cazier had introduced, also studied the Book of Mormon. We obtained a copy of an outline the Utah Stake had printed and studied that one year. Then the General Board printed a leaflet which was a success. Then came the magazine that took a great responsibility off of us.

Conditions were very different than as now. We were called to assist caring for the sick, sit up with them at night, also sitting up with the dead. It was customary not to leaver people alone with their dead at night. When death came, a member of the sisters would be called to make the burial clothes. We were expected to wash and prepare the body for burial. In hot weather, the body would be placed in an ice box. I have set up many nights with the sick and also with the dead and have assisted making many burial clothes. All this was done without any renumeration. Mary Fyper and Jane Vickers did the sewing for the dead. The Stake officers felt something should be done here to have burial cloths ready when needed. There was another difficulty. We could go to every store in town and not be able to get the material we wished. This matter was put before our Stake President. He felt we should do something about it. We discussed the matter with the Ward officers. They were willing to cooperate with us. We felt we should have burial clothes on hand. We went to Salt Lake City and made arrangements with the Z.C.M.I. for things that would be needed and visited the Bishop's Building and got suggestions from them. My counselors thought I should stop nursing and do that sewing, which I did. The first suit sold was in February 1922.

Besides visiting the wards looking after other details, the Stake Officers found time to do other things. We gave a bazzar to help our finances. We had two or three excurzions to the Manti Temple. We visited people in their homes and invited them to go. There were several old people see there were other things needed in the R.S. When I was nursing in some homes, there were things needed that the people could not provide. I had heard of one Stake that had a loan closet for the benefit of their wards. I felt that was needed in our stake. We talked the matter over their sewing machines. It was not many days until our closet was equiped sith seventy five articles to be used for maturnity cases and nineteen articles for babies and one hospital bed.

During the World War I, we were called to preserve all fruits and vegatables that could be got, dried carrots, beans, apples, plums, all must be bleached in a bleacher. In all this, the Wards helped willingly. I have labored in the Primary Stake for two years. I had charge of the adult class in the M.I.A. Supervised the ladies

On the 6th day of June, 1919, I took out a life membership in the Genealogical Society of Utah. I spent many weeks in research work and obtained hundreds of names of my forefathers, the Knowles and Osborn families. I spent four weeks at the Mesa Temple in Arizona. In the 1914, I went to the World's Geneological Convention in San Francisco as a representative of the Juab Stake R.S. I also went to Provo as a representative of the Stake R.S. and took a four weeks course in welfare work and was set apart as welfare worker in South Ward R.S. I held that position for on the old folks committee for twenty years as secretary and general work with the committee. I gave five minute talks in Sunday School and offered Prayers on Mother's day while I labored in the R.S. I sat up many nights with the sick and dying, prepared many bodies for burial. I have assisted in giving many blessings to my sisters for motherhood. Attended many prayer meetings for the sick and offered the special prayers. I have had the honor of paying tribute to eleven of my departed friends at their funeral services. To have had the priviledge of associating with so many wonderful women has enriched my life. I have taken an active part in politics. I have run for city recorder on the Democratic ticket and was defeated by six votes. I was appointed register agent for district no. 1 on June 1, 1932 and held that for several

REMINISCENCES OF THE DRAMA IN THE EARLY DAYS OF NEPHI, UTAH by Unity Knowles Chappell

When the pioneers arrived in Utah, Brigham Young knew the people must have some enjoyment. He recommended the dance and the drama. I am indebted to William A. C. Bryan for the following information concerning the first dramas given in Nephi. The first play given in Nephi was entitled "The Pioneers", and it was given by the children of the Pioneers. Each child represented one of the Pioneers, and William A. C. Bryan took the part of a doctor, as his father was a doctor. The play was given in a small log room, standing just west of the present site of the Forrest Hotel. This was the only place the Saints had to meet in at that time. Later, a one room drama. Later, the Social Hall was used.

In the early days, they played the following dramas: King Lear, McBeth, Merchant of Venice, Othellow the Moor. Some of the first player were Homer Gowan, John Kinke, David Salisbury, John Sidwell, Edward Booth, Charles Price, Edwin Williams, John Spencer, William May, Cyrus Mangum, Samuel Pitchforth, Mary Pitchforth, Caroline Bigler, Anah Kinkie, Amy Bigler and Rebecca May. Plays that were presented later the Social Hall were: Nick of the Woods, All That Glitters is not Gold, Pocahontas, Lucretia Borgie, Sarah the Forsaken, The Octoroon - a Southern play, Female Detective, Chimney Corner, Lost in London, Way Down East, Hidden Hand or Catitola the Newsboy, Two Orphans, Lady of Lyons, Not Guilty, Green Bushes, Foils: Or the Struggle for Life, The Stranger. Some of these later plays were given in the Opera House after it was built. The names of those who participated in the plays, as I remember them, were L.L. Hudson, Orson Cazier, W. P. Read, Harry McCune, Alfred McCune, Charles Haynes, Fred Chappell, D. K. Brown, Langley Bailey, William Bailey, T. L. Smith, E. D. Sorenson, Oliver Dalby, Collin Blackett, F. F. Hudson, Frank Teasdale, Cyrus Maugum, Will Hyde. The ladies included: Lizzie Bryan, Mary A. Parks, Georgian Parks, Sarah A. Cazier, Elizabeth Claridge, Lottle Claridge, Unity Chappell, Sarah Brown, Cordelia Mebb, Olive Hoyt, Della Hague, Chelnisia Morris, Louise Chappell, Cloe Pratt, Millie Schroder, and Anna Schroder.

To conclude the evenings entertainment, a farce was always given. Some of the farces presented were "I Shall Invite the Mayor". The Irish Broomaker", Freezing a Mother-in Law", Larkin's Love Letters". There Were Others I do Not Recall."

The Daughters of the Utah Pioneers have requested that I write some of my own experiences I have had in the drama. The first experince I had in taking a part in public, was when I was a child about ten years of age. We held Sunday School in the Old Social Hall The superintendent wanted to get the children to take part in the exercises. Tom encourage them, they would give a prize to the one that would learn a poem and give it the best. The prize was a card about six inches long, and four inches wide, and had a flower and a motto on it. I have forgotten the lines. To have one of those cards would be the joy of my life. To get it, I must learn a poem. We had one book, a McGuffy Reader, so I went to that and selected the "Village Blacksmith." It started something like this: "Under the spreading chestnut tree, the village smithie stands. The smith, a mighty man is he, with large and sinewy hands." etc. I studied that poem night and morning, till I had learned it perfect. I was so anxious to win one of those pretty cards. When the time came to give it, I had learned every work and line. The Sunday morning I was to give the reading, I not only wanted to give it perfect, I wanted to appear my very best. So, I put a little more grease on my hair, and a little more soot on my shoes. I sat on the front bench anxously waiting for my name to be called. When called, I must go up on the stage. There were five or six steps and when I got to the top, I started to say my peice, but the good old man that had charge said I must go to the middle of the stage and make a bow. This I did. I had my sister Sarah sit where I could see her and she was to make a sign to let me know if I was saying it too fast or not loud enough. I kept my eyes on her. I was so anxious to put it over just right. I said it without missing one word and took my sent and waited for the others to say their poems. When they were all through, that good old man arose and said, "Unity Ann Knowles, the Bestes Prize". Since that time, I have read many poems in public, took many parts in the drama, had the applicase of hundreds of people, but I never not the thrill I had when that nood old man said I had won

the "Bestes Prize". After that, my sister and I read a dialogue and we gave other poems.

Some years after that, there was a circus came to town. We were so thrilled with it so a few of us girls decided we would give a circus. There were Alice Evans, Lucy Evans, Christenia Christenson, Sarah Knowles, Unity Knowles, Charlotte Evans. While we were practicing, the acrobatics, Sarah slipped and hurt her arm. This put her out of that part of the show. The other part of the show consisted of a Negro stunt. Alice Evans took the part of Black Topsy, and I was Sambo. We put a tent up in my father's back yard (Thomas Knowles). The tent was made with wagon covers and the seats were boards. We charged one egg for admittance. Lottie Evans was door keeper, and I don't remember how much we made but we did have a fine time.

Some time after that, a young man came to Nephi from Salt Lake City. His name was Robert E. Pyper. He had taken part in some plays in Salt Lake and thought it would be fun if we would put on a play in Nephi. They got the play "Married Life". The cast was as follows: F. F. Hudaon, Robert Pyper, D. K. Brown, Collin Blackett, William Cazier, Sarah Knowles, Unity Knowles, Olive Hoyt, Cordelia Webb, and Belphia Hague. This was the first drama I took part in. The play went over fine, and we were very much enthused - thought we were on the road for a career. We did receive some severe criticism from the Home Dramatic Company, but we were determined to go on regardless of the criticism. The next play we got was "Among the Breakers". This met with success, so the boys wanted to branch out a little. They got a mule team, and took us over to Fountain Green. It took all day to get there, took the girls to the hotel, but the boys stayed at the hall. We put the play over, but it was not a success financially, as the audience consisted of about two or three dozen people, and I think some of them had complimentary tickets. We left, not quite so enthused as when we went. There was not enough money to pay the hotel bill. But we were not discouraged. We took a play to Eureka and there we met with success. Played two nights, went down a mine, and saw the miners at work.

They

Then they organized an Amateur Dramatic Company. They put on several other plays. By that time, the Home Dramatic Company was glad to have some of our company to help them out. The first play I took part in with the Home Dramatic Company was East Lynn and I took the part of an old maid - made quite a hit for an "amateur". Then I played in the "female Detective", a four act play. That was a very hard part. In that play, I had to cross a river in a small boat. The boat was built on a wooden wagon, which was pulled across the stage behind a water scene. I suppose they forgot to grease the wagon, for when the wagon began to move, it began to squeak. The harder I rowed, the louder it would squeak. Well some youngster giggled, and by the time I got over the river, quite a number seemed to be enjoying that squeak. I sure was provoked and embarrassed, as this was the most solemn part in the play - where the villian kills his wife, throws her in the river so he could marry a rich girl. He was supposed to take me back over the river, but when we got in the boat, he gave the signal to drop the curtain, which they did.

I also played the part of Tiddy, in "Lost in London", a four act play, and Tiddy was one of the leading characters. Then came the "Iwo Orphans", which we played for three nights to crowded houses. I took the part of Madam Lafracha. It was considered the best play ever put on in Nephi. But one thing happened that we regretted very much. To make the snow scene, they cut up paper in very small pieces. Two boys were placed up above the scenery, with large sacks of the cut up paper to represent snow, which they threw all over the stage. This scene was very pathetic. The blind girl was sitting on the church steps, where she sings as the people come out of the church, hoping to receive some money. The snow was supposed to be falling fast. One of the boys accidently dropped his sack of paper (snow) right in the center of the stage. It was awful to happen at that solem time, but it was so furny, we behind the scene couldn't help but laugh. The manager, however, did not laugh, and the boy felt very badly about it. When playing the part of Lafrancha in the "Two Orphans", one scene I had no part in, so thought I would go home and see how my baby was. When I returned, as I opened the back door to the stage, the city Harshal stepped out and took hold of my arm, saying, "We can't allow anything of this kind to go on in Nephi". I was startled for a moment, then saw the twinkle in his eyes, and knew it was just a joke.

When I took part in a play, I was paid five dollars a night. The play was put on two nights, so that gave me ten dollars. My husband also took part, so that gave him ten dollars, making twenty dollars. We wanted to put that in something we could keep, so we decided to buy a feather bed. We bought a twenty pound feather bed, and I still have the bed. I also played a part in "Foiled", or "A Struggle For Life and Liberty", a war play, that would take well just now. I also played a part in "Way Down East", also a part in the "Hidden Hand", as Capitola, the news boy. This play was well put over. In fact, all our plays were well put over. No pains were spared in staging a play. New scenery was painted whenever necessary, and all stage properties provided for the production, to make it as realistic as possible. I took part in the play "The Siege of Lueknow." There were others that I had small parts in, but cannot recall the names just now.

Each play, was followed by a farce, that is a comedy. The farces I took part in were "Freezing a Mother-in-Law", "Lakin's Love Letters", I Shall Invite the Mayor", and "Irish Broom-maker". I took part of the "Broom-maker's wife." It had been advertised as a side-splitting farce, but it was a perfect failure. When it was over, not a smile could you see. There were other farces, but I just don't remember the names.

One of the amusing incidents that happened, a man had to play a flute but the man selected for that part could not play, so a man who could play was stationed just outside of the wings to pay for him, and the person on the stage went through the motions. When the man on the stage stopped playing, the man in the wings went right on. It was an emabarrassing situation, but the man on the stage said "Oh, my", hear that echo!"





A SKETCH OF THE LIFE OF SARAH M. KNOWLES BROWN --written by herself

I was born July 15th, 18 9 in Nephi, Utah - the daughter of Thomas and Eliza Osborn Knowles. Wy father's home was a two-roomed adobe house situated where the home of Joseph Ostler on Center St. now stands. Father's home was then in the enclosure of the fort wall. This wall enclosed twelve blocks of city property - was 12 ft. high - 4 ft. thick at the bottom and 2 ft. thick at the top. It also had portholes at certain distances around it. The wall was built as a protection against the Indians. There was just two openings - one at the north and the other at the south. As we grew older and the Indian scare was over, we used play on top of the wall.

My mother died when I was 14 months old - consequently I never knew a mother's love. My father and mother were born and reared in England - mother in Gloustershire and father in Manchester. They lived in England until after their marriage. They were married Dec. 27th, 1844. They emmigrated to America in 1845. They were baptized in England (LDS Church) in 1842 by Elder Henry Webb. My father's parents were Richard and Sarah Roster Knowles. After my parents marriage, they were anxious to emigrate to America. It was at the time the Saints were driven from Nauvoo. Their headquarters at that time were in New York. Orson Hyde had charge of the Saints there at that time. In 1846, he advised the Saints who wished to migrate to Utah to go by boat from New York around Cape Horn to California. Samuel Brannan chartered the "Good Ship Brooklin" for 1200 to take them on that voyage. He charged \$50 for adult passengers and \$25 for children. 300 people applied for passage but only 238 could get the passage money. There were 70 men. 68 women, and 100 children. My grandfather, grandmother and their daughter Sarah were among the passengers. They set sail Feb. 4th, 1846. They made two stops - one at the Island Juan Fernando - Robinson Carusc - on May 4th - the other stop was on one of the Hawaiian Islands on June 4th-2 th. Storm and wind had blown them off their course. They landed in San Francisco on July 31st (called at that time Yuerba Buena). It was a hard journey and about all they had when they landed was the clothes they stood up in. Many were sick and died. The storm was so great the Captain told the company he was afraid the ship would go down, but an L.D.S. woman said the ship would not go down - they had been promised it would land. The food was poor, mostly dried biscuits and moldy bacon. It was at the time the war was on (the war with Mexico) and they saw the American flag go up. It was also at the time gold was discovered in California at Sutters mill. My grandparents and their daughter Sarah remained in California. At that time, there was only a few scattered houses. My father's sister Sarah married a man by the name of George Torrens. They finally became wealthy owned a court and much valuable property - one on Larkin St.

My father's family remained in Council Bluffs. They had three children born there - the eldest a boy named Thomas Henry - the next one a girl named Emma Eliza who died while they were in Council Bluffs. The third child they named Emeline Louisa. After my parents came to Utah three other children were born to them - a son named Alva Gowan - a daughter named Unity Ann and myself. My mother's health was poor while in Council Bluffs and on account of sickness in the family, father did not have means to come to Utah though he obtained work wherever he could. By this time, my grandparents had accumulated quite a bit of money. The leaders of the LDS Church had advised the Saints to come to Utah. My grandparents sent money to father to go to California - but father used the money to buy an outfit to come to Utah. The outfit consisted of a wagon, a yoke of oxen, a cow and provisions for the journey. My sister Emeline was only 10 days old when they left Council Bluffs. Father got a woman to cow for mother.

Here, I want to pay a tribute to my father. He was one of the most devout, temperate men I ever knew. Tea, coffee, cards, liquor or tobacco were never in his home. I never saw him in a fit of anger or use a profane word. On account of my mother's death when I was a babe, he was both father and mother to his family.

At the time of his sister Sarah's death, she had made a will in which she had left \$1,000 to thather. When he received the money, he immediately paid \$100 in tithing. My father was quite a student, though in his boyhood days, he had little opportunity of going to school - only a little at night. He went to work in a factory when only a child. Quite late in his life, he attended a writing school in Nephi taught by a Prof. Mounche(?). Father won the prize and was to receive a finished picture of penmanship made by the Prof. but unfortunately, the Prof.'s eyesight failed and the picture was not finished.

Father's life was hard, caring for his family and working hard as all the pioneers did in those early days. My father never remarried. He died Dec. 30th 1887, aged 64 years. My sister Emeline was only 8 years of age at the time of my mother's death. She too was all a mother could be at her tender age. She had to help with all the household duties and take care of the children, and all through her girlhood days she cared for the home. All through her life she was a devoted wife and mother. She married Henry Sutton of Nephi - died at the age of 57 I think. When we were children, we often rode to the field with father behind the ox team. As we grew older, we saw him cradle his grain with a sythe. The grain was shocked by hand, put into bundles, then into shocks. I remember going into the field to fight grasshoppers. Everyone had to help Kill them. Some were caught in sacks in the irrigation ditches and some were driven into piles of straw and burned. I remember one year father had a small patch of grain on the lot where we lived. All day, one of us on each side of the grain would walk up and down dragging a rope across it to keep the grasshoppers off. I think the grain was finally saved. I remember seeing the grasshoppers so thick they almost obscured the sun. We girls used to glean after the harvest was cut and one year my sister Una and I had quite a little stack at the side of father's big stack and was thrashed after father's. I remember many times of getting on the stack and placing the bundles.

I remember my father and brother Henry taking their turn going out at night to guard against the Indians. I remember one time there was trouble. Some Indians had been killed and we children were put down in Pitchforth cellar.

We always went in the field in the Fall with father to pick up potatoes after they were plowed. It was on one of those occasions where I first met the boy whom I afterward married. He was herding cows and I was picking up potatoes. I remember when we moved into another home outside of the fort wall. It was a two story - or perhaps story and half. It is still standing in 3rd E. and 1st N. and owned by some of the Bailey family.

Our girlhood days were quite different from the girlhood days of today. We washed wool, had picking bees, picking the wool to pieces, and cutting bees. We would have bushels of fruit gathered, have a cutting bee at night, and spread the fruit out to dry next day. I remember one year my sister Una and I dried fruit, sold it, and bought a nice three quarter length coat. I think that was the first coat I every had. Up to that time we wore shawls. Sometimes we helped father shock corn. Father had a large corn crib which he would have filled for winter. In early days in cold weather, they would shell the corn in the house using a spade over a tub. Many times we would have a big fire in the fireplace made of the burning cobs. Later, corn shellers came into use. When we where quite big girls, we used to herd sheep. I think nearly every family had a few sheep of their own. The sheep were kept at home. The Evans qirls, the Trantic(?) qirls, Parks qirls, and the Bowers were always herding sheep with us. One day when we were out with the sheep, a snow storm came up. We crowded the sheep up and started for home but on account of the storm, we got turned around and started the sheep up the Sanpete road. My sister Emeline came to our rescue and got us home. For our entertainment, we parched corn and made molasses candy. We were quite expert at playing jacks -not with the kind of jacks they play with now. We used small rocks and were quite adept at catching them on the back of our hands. We used to play hopscotch a great deal, also slide in the ice. In the summer evenings, after we grew to womanhood, we would gather in crowds outside of the house in the warm evening and sing songs. One of our neighbors, Charles Morris, had an organ. Their home was small - two small rooms - but they would allow us to stay there for hours singing and enjoying ourselves. There were very few organs in Nephi at that time. We were fond of dancing and in those days, the boys would have to ask the parents if they could take the girls to a dance. There was no running around to other towns to dances at that time. One holiday - I think it was the 4th of July - father did not want us to go to the dance. But after father had gone to bed, we naughty girls - my sister Una and I - climed out of our bedroom window and went to the dance. It had been raining. I had on a white dress, fell down in the mud, and could not dance. That was the reward I got for my disobedience. I remember the first time I went on a journey. Father took me to Provo where he exchanged his wool for yarn. Of course we did not make the journey in one day - stopped at Spanish Fork over night. Father had a loom and did all the weaving for the family. Wove our woolen sheets - jeans for the men's clothing andlindsy (?) for our dresses. I remember the last dress he wove for us - we called the color "magenta." Eather made the clothing for the men, pants, vests, and coats. At the time we had those last woolen dresses, my sister Emeline went to Salt Lake City - I think that was her first trip there - and I was bringing home some calico to make us a dress for the 4th of July, but we did not get the dresses made for that occasion.

We girls used to wind the bobins for father and help put the wrap in the loom. I never did any spinning, being the youngest of the family, I escaped that labor. The first shoool I went to was taught by Mary E. Love - afterward Mrs. Neff. It was in the corner of the old social hall where her father Andrew Love taught in the same room. I will mention here that Mrs. Neff died a year ago aged 91 years. Andrew Love was my next teacher - a rather gueer old gentleman, or gueer in his mode of teaching. He walked with a can across his back held at each end by his arms. In our early days of school we had no desks or tables - just had slates and slate pencils. We sat on long benches. The teacher was a little hard of hearing and when there was any talking on a bench, he would go along and crack each one in the head with his cane to get the right one. About the first thing he taught us was to spell. As we grew older, we sat at long tables. We became pretty good spellers. We could spell nearly every word in the old Blue Black speller. We used to stand around the room and have spelling matches. I remember I was much smaller than amny of the class. There were big boys, larger than myslef - W. A. C. Bryan, Joseph Bryan, Tom Wright, John Wright, David Udall and others. My sister Una and myslef spelled down the class and on another accasion. I spelled the whole class down and the teacher threw the book across the room. When he wanted to punish the girls for talking, he would make them sit by the boys. That would not be any punishment these days. There was no school vacation those days - school lasted the whole year. My father gave us the best there was those days but the best there was was not too good. When we were young we would sometimes take a little bottle of cream to school to play making butter. If the teacher found it, he would drink the cream and throw the bottle across the room. I also went to a school taught by John Chapman. It was a one room adobe building situated where the central school now stands. Below that where the Juab High stands was a public cow corral. People took their cows there in the mornings and a herder would take them out for the day and bring them back at night.

In early days, matches were scarce and many times when w^e wanted to get the evening meal I have run across the stree to get some live coals from the fire of Mrs. Andrews – grandmother of Will Andrews. I remember my sister hitting me on the head with a box of matches which set them on fire – that was quite a calamity.

We were interested theatrically when we were quite young. My brother put up a tent on my father's lot and we had circuses. We were fully dressed for the occasion with white stockings wrapped with colored braids. We had a little play and one of the girls (Alice Evans) was a black Topsy. We were really athletic. We used to practice climing the beams in my father's granary - climbing from hips of each other. On one occasion while practicing, I fell from one of their shoulders and sprained by wrist. I remember the first time I gave a poem in Sunday School. It was something about the birds and the last line of each verse ran like this - "I can draw them right up in my feathers you see and wam them to fly away - chee - chee" - dramatised by drawing my feet up. As I grew a little older, my Sunday School teacher was Amelia Goldsbrough. The school was held in the Social Hall. She gave each of her class a photgraph of herself, which was quite a gift. I think I still have the photograph.

There was no paint on our furniture those days. Everything was scrubbed white with sand. Everyone made their own soap - had no lye. Made the softening from ashes. I remember when the only light we had was a "tallow dip" - a dish of greace with a rag in it. Later we made candles -had candle moulds. I don't remember if there were any wire doors or window screens. In fly time - at meal time - one person or probably each one at the table would use a bough off a tree to keep the flies off. We had no clockstold the time by the shadlow of the sun. The cooking was done on the hearth and boiling in a pot hung in a crane in the fireplace. I remember when father got his first stove.

In our young womanhood days, our home was quite a rendezvous for the boys and girls. Father did not like the boys to stay after 10 or 30 oclock. Father would usually sit in the front room reading and the young people would sit in the kitchen. After 10 oclock, father would usually open the door and say "come boys, it is after 10 and time you were going home." One young man who was a brotherinlaw of Isaac H. Grace would say, "Allright Mr. Knowles, we'll be going in a few minutes." After I grew into young womanhood, I attended a school taught by Mary Hoyt (Breckholt) and the last school I attended was taught by Alfred White. It was in a one roomed adobe school house which stood where the residence of A. H. Belliston now stands. That was in the last year of my single life. The first time I saw a railroad train my sister's husband, Henry Sutton, took his team and wagon and drove with his wife, my sister Una and my self to fork which was as far as the team ran toward Nephi. It was quite thrilling to see the engine come puffing along. I remember the day when the first train ran into Nephi. Later when it ran as far south as Juab

one of the trainmen took a few of we girls for a ride in the caboose to Juab. That was quite and exciting event. In our young woomanhood days, we belonged to a dramatic troupe. I took part in several plays. The first one was entitled "Married Lif". There were 10 acttors in the play - five males and five females - Fred Hudson, Dan Brown, Will Cazier, Colin Blacket, and Rob Pyper of Salt Lake City, Unity Knowles, Deal Webb, Dolly Hoyt, Della Hague and myself. We had many good times at rehersals and were happy. The plays took place in the old Social Hall. That hall was built by those sturdy pioneers. They did so much it cannot all be mentioned.

On the 7th of March, 1880, I was married to Daniel K. Brown in the home of his father, K. H. Brown. The ceremony was performed by Apostle George Teasdale. I wore a white dress (muslin, trimmed with lace). Thathome is still standing - this time is owned by E. R. Fauest. My husband was teaching school at Levan at that time. During the first year of our married life, a son was born to us - we named him Daniel Merle. Soon after that time, I had my first trip to Salt Lake City. My cousin's husband, Rob Pyper met the train with horse and buqqy and drove around for me to see some of the sights of the city. At that time, the street cars were run by mules. When our son was about two years onld, we were sealed in the Salt Lake L.DS. Endowment House. The ceremony was performed by Daniel H. Wells. Before our child was three years old, my husband was called on a mission to Denmark. This mission was over two years duration. During that time, I lived with my father and kept house for him. There was no missionary fund at that time. My husband had accumulated a few hundred dollars which was used for him to pay his passage and as he needed it. I spent the time as pleasantly as possible - sang in the ward choir and enjoyed myself the best I could. I was young and enjoyed the company of young people. My husband's folks were very kind to me and while speaking of them, I will say that before coming to Nephi, they lived in Ephriam, Sanpete Co. They kept open house for Brigham Young and company as they traveled through the town with carriages. Grandpa Brown's home was their stopping place while in Ephriam. After my husband's return from his mission, he again taught school in Levan for a season. He also spent one year at the B. Y. U. at Provo. About this time, he bought a two-roomed house with two acres of land adjoining - that is the home where I now live. Later, he taught school in Nephi for a season or two. In 1887, a daughter was born to us. We named her Vinnie Annie. When weh was 3½ years old, another daughter was born to us. We named her Stella. In 1893, we made an addition to our home consisting of several rooms. Through our economy, we had saved enough to make that improvement. In that year, another daughter was born to us. We named her Ava Eliza. In1894, another daughter was born to us. We named her Lena Salome. About that time, my husband went into business with a Salt Lake firm by the name of Mac Elivir, Peirce and Goddard. My husband finally bought the interest belonging to Mr. Goddard. They traveled and sold school furniture and supplies - traveling into Arizona. All these years passed pleasantly. There were many house socials which we often attended when my husband was at home - also had many enjoyable times with my sisters and their husbands and other friends.

While things were running smoothly, my husband was called on another mission to Denmark. After being there sometime, he was banished from Denmark for the simple reason of preacting the Gospel. The priests there caused such trouble, he was ordered by the officers to leave the country. He was then sent to Norway to finish his mission. Before leaving for this mission, Mac-Elly and Pierce, the men he was working with did not belong to the Mormon faith - could not understand why he would leave a good job with a good salary - pay his own way to go on a mission for two years or more. That mission was also over two years duration. The children were all young - no salary coming in, but my husband made arrangements with the Coop store for me to get what we needed for our use. I did not make the bill larger than necessary and soon after his return, the bill was all paid up. Soon after he departed for that mission, our little girl Stella was strickenwith a severe case of scarlet fever - it resulted with a large abxcess forming on her neck. The doctor lanced her necka nd dear sister Elizabeth McCune was presnt. This good sister came every day for five weeks to care for the child - driving her horse and buggy. She would acc ept no pay for her labor.

During my husband's absense, the dramatic troupe of which he was a member, gave a benefit play for him. After his return, he commenced working for the firm of Crittler Bros. of Salt Lake City - acting as traveling salesman. In 1903, a son was born to us. We named him fred Carlyle. We were proud of this son as our older son was then 22 years old. In 1905, a daughter was born to us. We named her Ilia. My husband's mother died in 1903. After her death, grandpa Brown made his home with me in the winter time and with his other daughters-in-law in the summer months. On March 3, 1910, he passed away at my home. He was in his 90th year, though

still active until his final illness.

When my youngest daughter was 3 months old, my husband was still traveling for Cutler Bros. He traveld with a white-topped buggy and owned a fine driving team. He was very proud of this team. He used to call them "sweethearts". One sad morning, Aug. 27th, 1905 I was lying awake in bed and heard the hack drive up to my place. I went to the door and met my husband looking so tired and sick. When I asked what was the matter, he said, "typhoid". He had been taken seriously ill in St. George. He was taken by team to Modessa and came by train to Nephi traveling through the night. I gave him a bath, helped him into bed and told him I would soon nurse him back to health. But after suffering with typhoid and pneumonia, he passed away, Sept. 27th, 1905, just one month from the day he arrived home. He was aged 45 years - just in the prime of life. He was tall and erect, six feet in his stocking feet and weighted (his natural weight) 220 lbs. He was good natured and a wonderful father. He had a keen sense of humor and often kept large chowds in laughter. If ever the living greived for the dead, I greived for him. I greived to excess. I could not think it was time for him to go and of course had a thousand regrets. I had had no responsibility as to where our living had come and I felt so incapable to look after those affairs. Hiw I was going to live with no income and two babies in my arms, I could not tell. He left no insurance - one day he jokingly said, "I am not going to get insurace for someother fellow to enjoy." He had several peices of property - a home in the eastern part of the city which came from Grandpa Brown's estate - which I sold for a song. It is now owned by Alfred Orme. He owned a 40 acre farm on the Levan redge. We had just had our first crop off it while he lay ill. A piece of property on main street between the seminary and the silver maple service - also the home in which I now live - which was all free of debt. I also owned a five acre piece of land in the field which came f'om my father's estate. farming in the Levan ridge was not as profitable then as it is now - it was hard to get anyone to care for it. I was advised to sell it - which I did. So the property was sold piece by piece and all I own now is the hom in which I now live - which is free of debt. Some people could have kept thieir property, but I was so incapable. I did not do so. The children had to be clothed and fed and schooled, but only two of my children had the oportunity of finishing high school. All those who were old enough, went to work after my husband's death. Our eldest daughter Vinnie had just finished high school and started to teach in Utah Co. It was not compulsary at that time for a student to go to college before they were allowed to teach. After my husband's death, our eldest son Merle was not at home to live equin. He worked at different places - surveying and for the railroad - was baggage man at one time on a train from Galifornia to Utah. He married a young widow in California by the name of Anna Scholtz. On one accasion. he brought her with him. She riding in the baggage car.

As soon as my girls were able to work, they did so. Vinnie taght school for three years up to the time for her marriage - wages were small but too much praise cannot be given to my children. They have always helped to keep up the home. All through their married lives and up to the present time, they have contributed toward my home - bought rugs, clothes, table and bed linen and did everything they could to make me comfortable. My children have been loyal to each other - kept in close contact with each other - interested in each other's welfare. After my husband's death, I took in boarders, canvassed, nursed, sewed, and did other work and cared for my family with their help. Each year, for years, I planted and cultivated a large vegetable garden.

My Church activities - I joined the Relief Society when a girl and I have never lost interest in the same. I have held several responsible positions in the Relief Society. The South Ward R.S. was organized Dec. 4, 1890 with Ann Wilkey as President, Sarah A. Andrews (Cazier)an Elizabeth Miller as counselors. Sarah M. Brown as secretary and Harriet Christison asst. secretary. I served as secretary under Prs. Cazier until the time of her death - Aug 8th, 1912. Sarah A. Cazier was a very capable president. She gave gave me many compliments, which I felt I did not deseave. I will relate one incident that happened to me while she was president. One day as I was preparing to go to meeting, the thought came to me - I am in a condition to receive a blessing. I was still greiving much for my husband. As I sat in the secretary chair, Pres. Cazier rose to speak. She placed her hard on my head and gave me a wonderful blessing. She told me afterward that when whe rose to speak, she had no intention of doing so but her had went out automatically on my head. Later, I served as counselor to Jane D. Vickers - also to Elizabeth Linton as the organist.

I was also chosen as counselor to Maud Forrest, but on account of going to California each year, I resigned while she was president. At one time, I was chosen as one of the trustees of the South Ward Hall with Thuez M. Vickers and Jane Boothe. My sister Una and I were chosen as class leaders of the ladies department of the M.I.A. for two seasons. I was the first person in Nephi to visit the Arizona Temple. My daughter Stella who lived in Superior Arizona took me to Mesa, paid my room and board on two different occasions while I visited the temple. On another occasion, my sister Una and myslef were in Superior for two weeks. My daughter Stella took us to Mesa on Monday and back to Superior on Friday. We worked in the temple during that time.

One sad morning in 1920, a messenger came to my door with the news that my eldest son Merle had died suddenly of a heart attack in Seattle Washington. That his body was in a morgue there and by sending \$200, the body would be shipped to me. I borrowed the money from the bank. A. H. Belliston and Harry Wilkey going security for it. The money was sent, the body sent home and was buried in our family plot. All of my children were home for that occasion. That debt was paid by the sale of a piece of property. He always wrote me and kept me posted to where he was. Not long after that time, my daughter Vinnie went with husband to Romania taking her little daughter Ann with her. They remained there for 14 years, but during that time, she made two trips to America to visit us. Before they returned to make their home in California.

As time went on, I have spent the past 12 or 15 years in the winter seasons with my children in California, Arizona and Nevada where I have been most graciously treated. All my sons-in-law have treated me as they would their own mother, which has helped to make life more pleasant. I could make my home with any one of them, but I still like to cling to the old hearth stone that my husband provided for me. I have always like to work an I still like to work, but now at my advanced age, my ambition and my strength do not correspond very well. In my late widowhood days, I have made six star quilts - two mother flower garden quilts - on embroidered patch work quilt, also others. All of those I have given to my children. I have also made several braided rugs.

I joined the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers organization when it was first organized in Nephi. I was Chaplin in the County Camp for a term. I love flowers but have not been as successful in raising them as some people, but I still have my little flower garden. In the year 1933, my sister Una and I organized a mothers club of ladies of the South Ward of Nephi. There was 18 in number. We met at each other's homes and spent many pleaant hours in social chat and partaking of delicious refreshments. The following named ladies belonged Jane D. Mickers, Clara Park, Hariet Brough, Nellie Schofield, Elizabeth Cowan, Alice Carter, Addie Belliston, Fanny Olpin, Jane Śmith, Martha Carter, Susan Wilkey, Susan Downs, Charity Garrett, Laura Sowbey, Elizabeth Booth, Unity Chappell and myself. Since we started this organization, 8 of the number have passed away. Sometimes, I get lonely with none of my children living where I do, but scarcely a day passes that I do not get letters, cards, or parcels from them or I am sending the same. In that way, we keep in close contact with each other and the ditance apart does not seem so great. I love friends, especially friends who have been kind enough to come to my home and see me. I still enjoy a clean joke and many time I have read "live sparks" in Relief Society gatherings and other occasions. I love people and like to mingle with them I have a keen sense of how people are dressed and I enjoy seeing well-kept homes, lawns and flowers. I love poetry and have many peoms in scrap books. I have kept the "work of wis dom " all my life. Never drank tea, coffee or liquor - though I have mate matry mistakes in my life. I have written this sketch of my life myself, no one has told me what to write or how to write it. I know there are many gramatical errors which can be corrected by my children if they see fit. I wrote this first in pencil when I was 84 years old and now in a few weeks I will be 86 as I have copied it. I still enjoy life, able to keep my home reasonably clean and if I live, and my health will permit, I would like tolive to see the terrible war at an end and see peace in the earth. I have six living children, 10 gran children, and 4 great grandchildren. I have two grandsons in the army, one in the Navy, two granddaughters husband's in the Army, and at the time I write this, one sonin law who has recently been released. My eldest son married Anna Sholtz. My eldest daughter Vinnie married Samuel Lowe and later married Lewis M. Drader. Second daughter, Stella married Ernest E. Slack. Third daughter Ava, married Walter F. Richardson, fourth dauther, Salome married Harey Wilkey, later married Carl O. Scannell. My son Fred Carlyle Brown married Elizabeth A. Hennenkamp. Ilia my 5th daughter married Loren B. Warner.

I have recoppied this now in my 89th year.



Note: This sheet still needs considerable research to establish the fact that so many children did not live to maturity. Family records are not good but need to be exhausted.

David Webb was a superintendent of a number of textile factories in England, where he met and married his first wife, Esther. After coming to America, he settled in the states, then moved to Utah. He was one of the early settlers of Nephi, where he was elected a councilor in 1852 at the first election. He was named a member of a committee in 1854 to fortify Nephi against Indian attacks. He was a choir leader, made looms and had quite a reputation as a weaver. He also made shoes for his family. After reaching America, David met and married Caroline in a polygamous union. He had two large families but the two wives did not get along very well so the half brothers and sisters were not well acquainted. Little is known about Caroline, but on her death, a very large monument was placed on her grave - a symbol of devotion from her children.

William Cole Ockey, the first of ten children, was born in Salt Lake City, Utah. His family moved to Nephi prior to July 4, 1854. He married Sarah Ann as a young man and they had one child, Leah. When Leah was four years old, Sarah Ann died.

In November, 1889, William married Lizzetta Simpson. They had two sons, William Cecil and Gordon, born in 1905 and 1910. William was a very successful sheepman and later a cattleman.

When Leah had been married for twelve years, her husband, Alma died, leaving Leah and five children. Grandpa William took the family in and took responsibility for them. He enjoyed the responsibility and the new family.

William's son Eugene died at age eight. His son William served in World War I, and his son Gordon died in World War II when a Japanese suicide pilot guided his plane into Gordon's ship.

William died of pneumonia in 1925 at the age of seventy five. He was loved by all who knew him - particularly by his children and grandchildren.

Leah was only four years old when her mother died, but she was raised by a kind a loving father, her step-mother Lizzetta, and her aunt Zelnora Webb Ockey. Leah's husband, Sisson Chase, was a photographer at Chase Studio when he died of a heart attack at the age of twenty nine, leaving Leah with five small children, the youngest being five months old. Grandpa William Ockey then took responsibility for the family.

For ten years, Leah was treasurer of Nephi City but because of poor health she had to resign. Tragedy struck when her oldest son Donald, diet of sarcoma at the age of twenty four after he had been married only a year and a half. Her son, Alma, "Bud", was killed in a truck-auto accident in December, 1941 and was buried on Pearl Harbor day. He was only thirty four, and left a wife and daughter. Leah was very worried all the time her son Ralph served in World War II. She never remarried and lived to a ripe old age.

UNUSUAL EXPERIENCE

At 4 years, Leah's mother died and at night she was crying in her pillow, when a light came - like a lamb into the room. She sat up and there was her Mot'er standing in the pool of light. Leah knew that her mother was dead and being frightened, buried her head under the covers. When she looked again. her mother was gone. Whe always wondered

what her mother had come to say. On another occasion, years later as she was sleeping, a voice woke her with the words. "Leah, get out of bed!" It was a quiet night and she paid no heed, but when the voice came again - "Leah, get out of bed!", she jumped out of bed just a few moments before a large piece of plaster fell on her pillow. She would have been killed.

She had many other similar experiences throughout her life.





When I met the Lorenzo Webb family in 1917, they owned a dairy ranch. northeast of Nephi Utah. Lorenzo's father, David was a polygamist and had two wives. There were 5 children in the David and Caroline family. Lorenzo being the oldest. His father was a poor provider for the two families, so Lorenzo had to go to work at the age of 12 to provide for his mother and her children - Henry, Charles, Cordelia, and Sarah. Lorenzo drove a freight wagon from Salt Lake City to cities in California and on his return, he would bring lumber to Salt Lake City which was used in the Mormon Tabernacle. Lorenzo married and had four children. In later years, he lived with his son Hosmer and family in Cut Bank MT. Lorenzo lived to be 81 years old and is buried in Cut Bank near the home of Hosmer Webb.
